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Introduction

At the time these deeds were recorded, the land area of Jackson County, Alabama, was different from what it is today. The northern boundary was the Tennessee state line. The Tennessee River formed the eastern and southern boundaries from Long Island to the Paint Rock River. The Paint Rock River formed the western boundary to a point where the Old Cherokee School boundary line intersected the river. From this point the boundary on the west was the Cherokee boundary to the height of the land of Keel's Mountain. The western boundary then followed the meandering "height of the land" to the Tennessee state line near Huntland, Tennessee. The northern half of the western boundary was established by the Alabama Legislature in 1825 when Decatur County was abolished.

Sand Mountain, to the east and south, was a part of the Cherokee Nation until 1836. A few other interesting facts recorded in Deed Book F may be found in the appendix to this index.
