WOOSLEY FAMILY

William Alexander Woosley was a soldier of the War of 1812, a private in the 3rd Regiment of the Virginia Militia. He is buried beside his wife, Mary Fisk, in the old Blue Springs cemetery at Larkinsville, Jackson county, Alabama. His grave has been marked by the Daughters of 1812. Their tombstones read:

William A. Woosley	Mary Woosley (1)
Born Sept. 2, 1796 (Bible says 1790)	born October 26, 1800
died March 19, 1869	died March 31, 1860

William Alexander Woosley was the son of Revolutionary soldier, Aaron Walden Woosley who is believed to be buried in Lincoln County, Tennessee, where he applied for Revolutionary War pension in 1818. His pension no. 14,879^{was dated} "West Tennessee."

(1) There has been some doubt as to what Mary's maiden name was. Some say Morris while others say Fisk. There seems to be little doubt that John Hunt ~~of~~^{was} ~~earl~~for whom Huntsville named, was an early settler of Hawkins county, Tennessee. Worth S. Ray's "Tennessee Cousins," page 78... "Greene Co., Tennessee.. "An item in the Knoxville Gazette, dated Sept. 3, 1792 is to the effect that John Hunt was at that time Sheriff of Hawkins County."

Page 90 of the same book.... "David Larkin appointed Justice of the Peace in Hawkins county 1790." So it seems that the Hunt and Larkin families ~~were~~^{may have been} early friends before they settled in Franklin county, Tennessee, about 1806. The exact date that David Larkin, Jr. settled in what is now known as Larkinsville ^{Jackson Co. Ala.} is not known but he entered land there in 1830 as shown by tract books in ^{Jackson} county courthouse.

Brewer's History, of Alabama, page 363-64 states:

"William Acklen was one of the earliest white settlers of Madison county and of the state. He was born in Tazewell, Tennessee, December 1802 (some researchers think John Hunt left Huntsville and went back to Tazewell where he died ^{xps}) His father was a Virginian, and sheriff of Claiborne county, Tenn. at one time. Marrying a daughter of Capt. John Hunt, the founder of Huntsville, he settled in Madison county in 1808 with his family. Wm. Acklen, the son of this worthy pair was graduated at Greenville College, Tenn. read law under Ebenezer Titus in Huntsville and came to the bar in 1823. Caswell R. Clifton (afterwards a circuit court judge in Miss.) Joseph Acklen, and Smith D. Hale were at separate periods the law partners of Mr. Acklen. In 1826 he represented Madison in the house, and was four times returned; but in 1832 he was

e 73
elected solicitor, a position he filled with great credit for twelve years. In 1853 he defeated Hon. Wm. Fleming for State Senator, and served four years. He was a hale and stout man, though disabled for some years by an accident. Physically he was well constituted, with an intellectual head, and cheerful expression. As a solicitor he was very efficient, and as a man was honorable and energetic. He married a daughter of Mr. Edmund King of Shelby, and lost a son at Gaines' Mill. His brother Joseph was Federal District Attorney for Alabama and his brother John was sheriff of Madison county. Mr. Acklen died in May 1872.

An excerpt from a letter to Mr. George R. Hunt, Huntsville, Alabama, from Cornelia Hunt Phillips, 1726 Valencia Street, Santa Ana, California, July 20, 1926.... (Mrs. Phillips was a granddaughter of John Hunt, ^{for whom} ~~namesake~~ of Huntsville, Ala. *named*)
"My father was David Nelson Hunt, who was a son of John Hunt, in turn a son of John Hunt for whom Huntsville, Ala. *named*
My grandfather Hunt (John) married Rhoda Henderson of North Carolina, a daughter of Thomas Henderson, a captain in the Revolutionary War. They had nine children--Samuel Fidelius, later of Jackson, Miss., John, Thomas and David, and daughters Sallie, Pollie, Cordelia, Catherine, Orlena, Narcissa Hunt who married William Fouchee in Tazewell, Tenn (this last one sent to me and not very clear but this seems to be correct--Mrs. Phillips)

"Grandfather Hunt went from Tennessee to Missouri and settled in Bolivar, Polk county. He was elected in Jefferson City and is buried in the State plot, having died the 27th of March, 1847. His father was sheriff for 17 consecutive years before moving to Mississippi.

"My father, David Nelson Hunt, married my mother, Cornelia Smith Beazeley in Jackson at Uncle Fied Fide's home. Uncle Fide adopted a boy who was named Rufus.

"My grandfather Hunt had several brothers, whom I know of two--William and Ben, and there were possibly others. Both the Hunts and the Beazeleys, my mother's people, came originally from Virginia. Grandfather Beazeley from Lynchburg to Tennessee, and hers to Mississippi. They had a plantation near Jackson where he died of yellow fever. He was Samuel S. Beazeley. I have been told that Great grandfathers Hunt and Henderson were officers in the Revolutionary War.

"I am 68 years old and have a sister, Sue Fidelia Horton, 69 of Wichita, Kansas.

"The living descendants of John Hunt, founder of Spring, for whom Huntsville is named, so far as known are as follows: Mrs. Ann Hunt Moore, Huntland, Tenn., only child of Clinton A. Hunt and Tappey Lipscomb Hunt; Mrs. Addie Hunt Nelson, Corinth, Miss., and George R. Hunt, Huntsville, Ala, only living children of George W. Hunt and Priscilla Powell Hunt; W. B. Hunt and Rosa Hunt Stuart of SCOTTSBORO, Ala; also Shepard Hunt, Chattanooga, Tenn.; only living children of David Hunt and Marticia Hunt; ^(Shelton) Cornelia Hunt Phillips, dau. of

David Nelson Hunt and Cornelia Beazeley Hunt, of Santa Ana, California."

"Milton Carter died before 1880 in or near New Market, Ala ^(Madison Co. - eps) but no marker at his grave, believed to be buried in the Jacks section of a cemetery. What was maiden name of Minerva Lena#(?) Givens; when & where was she born in Tenn? And who were her parents? Appreciate hearing from Carter descendants in Alabama."

"The Garner Graveyard is located about 2 miles east of Paint Rock on the south side of Hwy 72 on land presently owned by George Dicus of Scottsboro, Ala.

"From my childhood I knew my great grandparents Arthur Smith Frazier and Elizabeth Petty Frazier. My grandfather Alexander Smith Frazier and my brother Albert Knowlton McCulley were buried at the Garner Graveyard near Paint Rock, Alabama. It is terribly grown up and neglected. there are 3 graves enclosed with native limestone. I believe they are the graves of my great grandparents, Arthur Smith Frazier and Elizabeth Petty Frazier and my grandfather Alexander Smith Frazier. My great grandparents died within 8 days of each other. Arthur Smith Frazier died Oct 18, 1857 and his wife Elizabeth Petty Frazier died Oct 26, 1857.

"Southern Democrat, pub. Huntsville, Ala, Nov 12, 1857....

"Died on the 18th in Jackson County, Alabama, Mr. Arthur Smith Frazier an old and respectable citizen of that county and on the 26th his widow Mrs. Elizabeth Frazier."

"My grandfather, Alexander Smith Frazier died 1 Mar 1866 and from my own personal knowledge he is buried in the Garner Graveyard. I also know that my uncle William A. Frazier who died 14 Jan 1885 and my brother Albert Knowlton McCulley

who died 30 Jan 1885 are buried there. There is only one marker in the Garner graveyard and I lost my notes and cannot remember the name but I believe it is an infant.

"In the 1805 Land Lottery records for Montgomery county, Ga. there is listed a Drury Robards, Sr. and Drury, Jr., There were four men listed in Montgomery county who spelled their

name "Robards"--Gray, John, William and Drue. There is a Drury Roberts listed in the Georgia Roster of the Revolutionary War. This name seems to be spelled Drury, Drue, Drewry--Robards, Roberds and Roberts.

"His family is recorded in the Jackson county census records for 1830, 1840 and 1850 (and I think in 1860 though the ages are different, the names are Drue, Rebecca, Nancy and William). In 1850 they are listed Roberds, Drury, 60, Rebecca 50, Nancy 21, Matthew 18, Rebecca 12, Peter# 8, William 6.

"Levi Peter Roberts married Mary Elizabeth Hall March 24, 1861 in Jackson county by Noah Shelton, J. P. He joined the army at Paint Rock, Ala Sept. 17, 1861. He is listed in the 1870 Jackson county census as Peter Roberts, 30, Ala., Teacher; Elizabeth 26, Ala, Sarah 10 Ala. I'm curious about Sarah as I don't think she was a child. Their children were: Priscilla, James and John. Later he became a Methodist elder and circuit rider. They went to Indiana and later moved to South Pittsburg, Tenn where he died in 1914.

"The only brother that I have any knowledge of is William. He lived in Mountain Home, Ark. and was in some war--guess Civil War."

I have a marriage certificate of Drury Roberts & Rebecca Matlock dated June 28, 1838 in Madison Co, Alabama Territory of the U.S. Also a record where he served ~~with~~ in the Jackson County Mounted Volunteers in the Florida War with the Indians 1836-1837

DODSON CEMETERY

This old cemetery is located at Limrock, Alabama. Go down the old Limrock road past Limrock school. Turn rt. on paved road just before you cross a small bridge. The cem is located on right of road just as you start around the first bend in the road. Cannot be seen from road. This is a most unusual cemetery. The five Dodson graves have a wall about 4 ft. high-dressed limestone rock-around them, some are individual walls and sometimes a couple enclosed in one wall. There was an ancient mound at the very front of this old cemetery, a good distance from the above graves. No markings could be found. Could barely see it for the growth. Our opinion is that it was here long before William Dodson selected this site for his graveyard. There is an old cedar barn still standing near these graves and an old smokehouse still stands up on a hill (cannot be seen from road) that probably belonged to William Dodson. Flowers and fruit trees can still be seen blooming in the spring around the old place.
