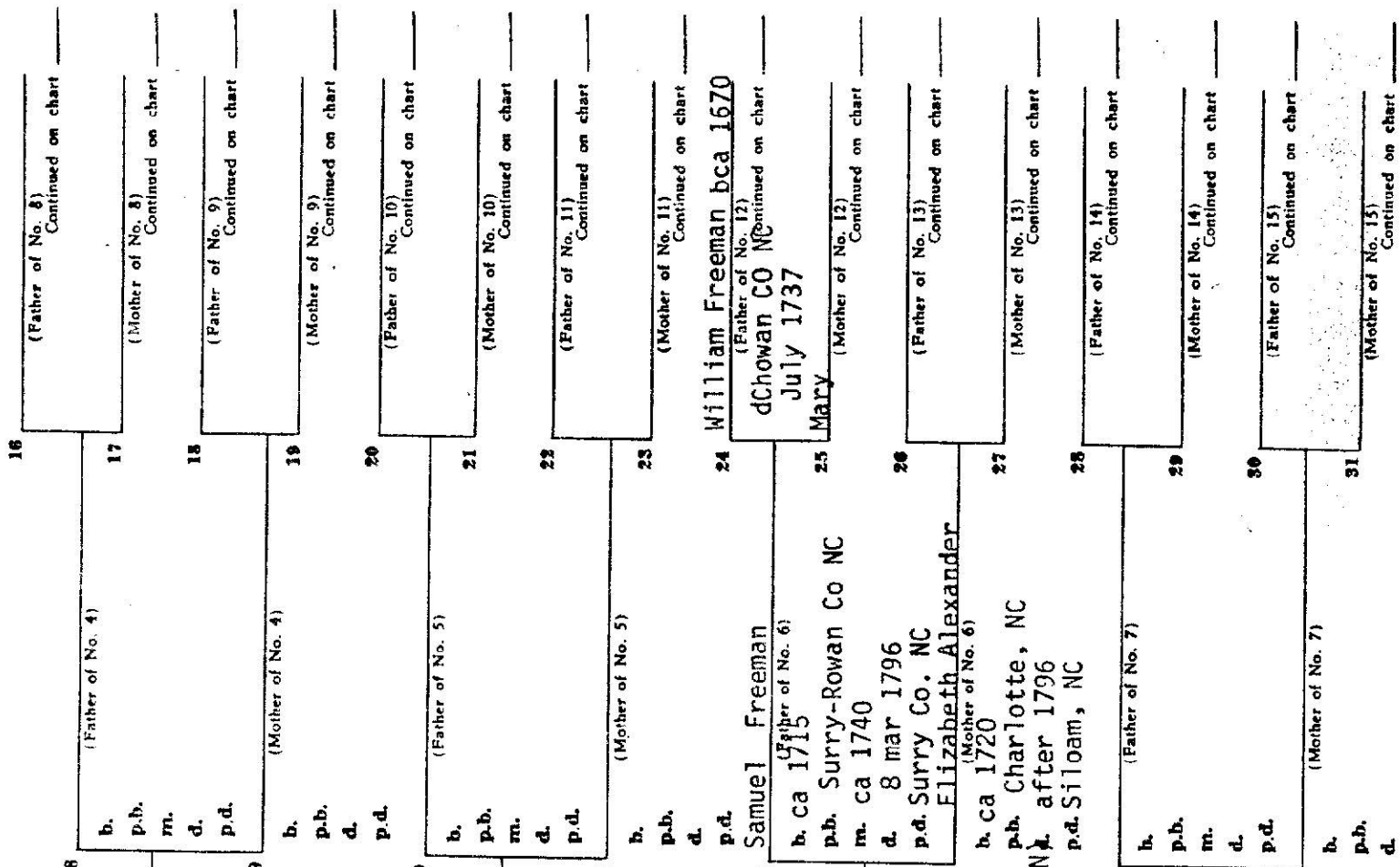

Dear J. C.

Thank you for your chart and Mr. Duggan's letter copy. The chart will make it easier for me to follow your lines.

Frankly, I don't know what to tell you about The Brewster - Freeman connection. I have run into it time and again in my Freeman research but, truthfully, I have seen no proof to support it. Maybe Mr. Duggan has found this proof and the connecting link. I certainly hope so and that he will share it with us.

"The Heritage of Surry Co. N.C." Vol 1, 1983 - Edited by Sister Burtlett Jackson and published by Surry County Genealogical Assoc lists the Freeman Family # 239, beginning on page 188. This deals with the Freeman - Brewster connection but does not document it. As I see it, we need proof that William Freeman who died in Old Chowan Precinct N.C. and left will dated 1736 is the son of John Freeman who married Mercy (Mary/Marcy) Prence. The afore mentioned item gives Mercy Prence as Mercy Brewster. The Mayflower Index indicates she is Mercy Prence the daughter of Gov. Thomas Prence and Patience Brewster. If we can find proof that our William was the son of John Freeman, then we can accept Brewster as another line, also Prence. Until then we are just spinning our wheels. There must have been tradition in the early Freeman family regarding Freeman - Brewster. In old correspondence I have seen, it is mentioned as early as 1925 by a descendant of Temperance Freeman Grant who married Richard Kirby (bro. of your Joseph) as her second husband.

I can document our line thru William Freeman who died ca 1736 old Chowan Prec. N.C. from Wills, Deeds, Bible Records and etc. The Samuel Freeman Bible Record gives the birth date of Joshua Freeman as April 14, 1754. I note this birth date as ca 1745 in Mr. Duggan's and your record. This Bible Record is found in the Pension Application of Jeremiah Early and is his wife who was Samuel Freeman's daughter Rachel.

I am having eye problems and have to use lined stationery. Hopefully I'll be able to get new glasses in about three weeks and be more active in research.

I know that Lital did go to Texas and was a successful business man. The late John B. Benson, Elma's husband) saw him either in Texas or he came back on a visit to Jackson Co., Ala.

"I disagree that 4 brothers came to Alabama. JAMES did not come He married, lived and died and is buried on his father's old Kirby farm. I have pictures of his gravestone and his wife Lydia Ayers- Ayers. This cemetery is in the letter written by Mr. Will E. Parham to Mr. J. & J. Pippin (see letter). The John L. Kirby wshozmzz who married Elizabeth Sarah Pate are Clarence Kirby's grandparents.

Dear Sir:- Your letter to our "County Court Clerk", handed to me as he does
not hunt these Family matters. Also for 40 years I have been familiar with
all the Records, having copied wills, Deeds, marriages, and much of the early
minutes of the County, and have these in my home. Only short abstracts of what
I could shorten. We have no name of an Joel Kerby, Kirby, Curby, :

The first is 12/12 1797 when ²Richard Kirby is remitted one White Poll; in
July 1800 he is on Jury so we have him until ³a will is filed, signed 4/29,
1811, says wife Sarah, sons James, Richard, Joseph, John, Francis, to
Elizabeth Addan (Addair) and her children now alive, to John's son - Richard,
daughters Polly, Rebecca, Jean; my negroes (names them) Executors to be James
and Richard Kerby; witness - Darcus and Nancy Stephens. (the original will may
state when filed, I do not know if here or not, so many are lost) Minutes say
" 6/26 1818 Certifivate of Sarah Kirby proven in Court and ordered Certified".
I do not know what that means many did have it that way for Pensions.

Richard must have served some way in Rev. War! ← Note

④ Will of James Kerby signed 11/3 1829 says wife Lydia, she to keep children
together untill youngest is aged 21 years; executors to be James and John
Stephens; witnesses Elisha Dashm, Joseph Kerby; he is mentioned 9/28 1814
as security for a ~~man~~ man to run an ordinary; on 12/29 1814 is appointed
adminstrator of estate of Francis deceased; on july 6/23 1818.

We find a James L. Kirby in 1850 buying land in Blount and Knox Counties;
sell in in 1851. land in 11th District of Blount. (that is where the old
home and Cemetery is)

① Francis Kirby on 5/26 1803 is made overseer of a road; he and Joseph Kirby
were on same Jury with Richard Kerby; a Francis bought and sold land in 11th
District.

In 1839 Lydia Kerby is adm. of Richard and Franklin Kirby and sold a negro.
*Not my Joseph, believe he was son of Francis ①. This Joseph probably the
James Kirby w. Ill.*

In 1841 Clinton and Mariah Kirby sell land of the Trice Estate, while living
in Jackson County, Alabama, and Franklin Kirby joins in the Deed.

In 1853 Richard and Narcissa Moody (Erigh?) Kirby sell land that had belonged
to Dr. Isaac Wright, in 1850 they joined in selling a negro.
Richard buys and sells land in 11th Dist. in 1847, 1852, 1863, 1865 (I did not
trace later) (I knew one Richard in 1870 went to school with his daughter, Lydia)
We find name of Peter Curby in May 1800 recovered a judgement in Court for
debt Vs-John Cowan.

On 3/1 1805 Samuel George is appointed to take the taxables on men in
Capt. Kirby's Company (that is all we can get)

On 9/30 1814 Sarah Kerby was assessed 191 acres land, 1 white and 8 black polls

In Estate papers we see 12/29 1835 Lydia Kerby made bond as administratrix, with will attached; she shows sales on 1/21 1836, and reports inventory on 3/26 1836, as widow of James Kerby; Oct. term Court made Wm. Singleton guardian of minor heir of James; and Richard is gdn. of Nancy and James; with Franklin Kirby as gdn. of Rhoda, William and Caroline A. Kirby; later Wm. Singleton as gdn. of Caroline settled with me in full on 1/13 1854 paying her \$812.70

du. of Elizabeth Adaire in will of 1811.

When James Kerby died he had in his hands money for Barbara Adaire, and Lydia received it as adm. of him, then her administrators turned it over to James S. Dear J.C. and Catherine:

Thanks for your letter of 1/24! Your data added the father of Elder Wm Brewster -- another generation. We had visited the local Mormon center. They had several Wm Brewsters, several wives named Mary, and even several Wrestling Brewsters! All from the late 1500s/early 1600s time frame. Your articles helped clear the air. The clarification of Patience was also valuable.

Apparently, from your articles, Brewster spent time in "the Low Lands", which I assumed meant Holland. Also, prior to boarding the Mayflower, several came from Leyden, which may be Leyden, Holland. The birthplace of some of the Brewster kids may thus have been Holland rather than England.

We'll be interested in Mrs. Watkins' reaction to the info. We think everything has checked out, but since she's a Freeman researcher specialist, we'll feel even better if she finds no flaws in the data.

You mentioned the Blount County Genealogy Society. Maybe Kathleen should join it, too, since her (and your) Parks, Kirby, and Freeman ancestors all filtered through that area. To whom should she write, and what are the dues?

I think I mentioned, we are again going to the Yucatan 2/19-26, so maybe we too will get some warm sun (as you are getting) during the cold season here. Last year we got quite a sunburn climbing the pyramids at Uxmal and Chichén Itzá.

Thank you for your chart and Mr. Duggan's letter. The chart will make it easier for me to follow your lines.

Frankly, I don't know what to tell you about the Brewster-Freeman connection. I have run into it time and again in my Freeman research but, truthfully, I have seen no proof to support it. Maybe Mr. Duggan has found this proof and the connecting link. I certainly hope so and that he will share it with us.

"The Heritage of Surry Co. N.C." Vol 1, 1983 - Edited by Sister Berlett Jackson and published by Surry County Genealogical Assoc lists the Freeman Family # 239, beginning on page 188. This deals with the Freeman-Brewster connection but does not document it. As I see it, we need proof that William Freeman who died in Old Chowan Precinct N.C. and left will dated 1736 is the son of John Freeman who married Mercy (Mary/Marcy) Prince. The afore mentioned item gives Mercy Prince as Mercy Brewster. The Mayflower Index and she is Mercy Prince the daughter of Gov. Thomas Prince and Patience Brewster. If we can find proof that our William was the son of John Freeman, then we can accept Brewster as another line, also Prince. Until then we are just spinning our wheels. There must have been tradition in the early Freeman family regarding Freeman-Brewster. In old correspondence I have seen, it is mentioned as early as 1925 by a descendant of Temperance Freeman Grant who married Richard Kirby (bro. of your Joseph) as her second husband.

I can document our line thru William Freeman who d ca 1736 old Chowan Pct. N.C. from Wills, Deeds, Bibb Records and etc. The Samuel Freeman Bibb Record gives the birth date of Joshua Freeman as April 14, 1754. I note this birth date as ca 1745 in Mr. Duggan's and your record. This Bible Recor. is found in the Pension Application of Jeremiah Early and his wife who was Samuel Freeman's daughter Rachel.

"Don't know why she omitted JOSEPH as a son. Feel sure they never had a copy of the original Will of RICHARD KIRBY, died 1811, Blount County, Tennessee.

"Re the notes written by Mrs. Proctor: I did get marriage of JOHN KIRBY TO JANE ADAIR, Montgomery County, Virginia."

"Don't know where Mrs. Proctor found Elizabeth's 2nd marriage to Thomas HOPE. My Knoxville cousin (descendant of son FRANCIS) cannot find it.

2nd page May 12, 1934 letter: "I -am fascinated by Calvin Tunnell's visit to Scottsboro, Alabama! He stopped "a few minutes" and stayed several days! I'm confused by the 2 Richards. He must have been hunting "Sauta Dick". "I think surely it was "Sauta Dick" he was hunting as he said "he didn't know me" and Sauta Dick was older than my Richard. Also Richard Kirby (son of Richard 1st) would have lived farther than 8 miles from Section Ferry where the Pierce's lived? Also dead before 1860! Mrs. Proctor's note: "Here she did not know that SARAH KIRBY married THOMAS JUSTICE (buried in Kirby Cemetery, Backbone

Ridge) before she married JABEZ (Gabe) Perkins.

Letter no 2, dated June 27, 1934: "The only thing of interest is the "Sarah Kirby" in will of CHARLES WITT, written 1771, probated 1781(?), Halifax County, Virginia." Note--error, she says C. Witt born 1812 (1712?)

Letter no. 3, February 24, 1936.. "Again that WESLEY!"

1790 census Surry Co., N.C., RICHARD KIRBY family complete except for 1 daughter missing. I have always thought the daughter missing was ELIZABETH who was already married to Thomas Addair. Miss Ball says they 'married about 1794,' So may be that Richard and Sarah's youngest daughter "Polly" (Mary) not born then.

"The 'cousin RHODA KIRBY married ~~cousin~~ cousin JOHN MILLER" I know Rhoda was a daughter of James and Lydia (Ayers) Kirby. Maybe the "cousin" part of John Miller was on the PORTER side of the family and not on the Kirby side? Just as Miss Ball guesses! But could be ADDAIR connection and the title of "cousin" misleading, an old southern custom!

Letter no. 4, Dec 9, 1936. "This is the one that helps the most! My knowledge of ADDAIRS so scanty, yet not my direct line. I've hunted them, hoping for a Revolutionary War soldier for a descendant. However, in this letter paragraph 2, Miss Ball says, "I have copied for you and am enclosing the sheets all that I have on the family of John Kirby and Jane Adair Kirby" Where do you suppose those sheets are? Who has them?

"In my search for JOHN KIRBY and Jane Adair marriage, THE CLERK of court of Montgomery County, Virginia, who sent me the marriage certificate, sent a notation of "a deed from Thomas and Elizabeth Addair to James Addair, Jr. 1799."

"This gives me something to work on even though Miss Ball was not sure about the parents of Jane Addair. Maybe I can succeed where she failed, as ^{after} ~~later~~ all, they did not find the will of our Richard Kirby who died 1811 Blount County, Tennessee. This letter is "chockfull" of data. Wish we had copies of Mrs. Proctor's letters to Miss Ball!

Kirby data from Inez J. Murphy to Christine Sumner, continued...."All of first page, except last 4 lines, are children and descendants of Richard Kirby (the son of Richard 1st) who married 3 times. The "Sauta Dick" was a son of John Kirby, one of 3 brothers who came to Alabama. He was named in Richards will, 1811, Blount County, Tenn. as John's son Richard and got \$100. "Sauta Dick" and Elizabeth Gross Kirby are the SKELTON ancestors. The "Lawyer Richard Kirby" is my great grandfather and the brother of Bill's (Sumner) Lucinda (Kirby) Parks.

Page 2. The "Mrs. Jenkins" my grandmother. Census records show Silas to be a son of Joshua. I do wish I could find some descendants of Silas Kirby. The statement "Silas Kirby married a Bird, the aunt of the John Snodgrass family interests me very much!"

ERROR in paragraph 2, page 2..."Sauta Dick and Mrs. Pierce" did not come from S., C., Mrs. Pierce was Virginia Dare (Adair contraction?). She and Sauta Dick were brother and sister, children of John Kirby and Jane Adair (see Skelton Bible records). They came with their parents from Tenn were not grown men!

"The 'Sauta Dick's' brother who lived at Gadsden was Thomas Hawkins Kirby, moved there between 1840, 1850 (see census records from Jackson County, Alabama/

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

Joshua Freeman gave aid to the Colony of North Carolina in the Revolution by furnishing supplies. For this he is named in a manuscript record found in North Carolina in the records of the Historical Commission of N.C. Copy of the reference sent by Mrs. Daisy C. Whitehead, Genealogist and associated with the Historical Commission. Mrs. Daisy C. Whitehead, 225½ Forest Road, Raleigh, N.C. to Mrs. William S. Faulkner (Anna A. Kirk Faulkner) 1306 Sherman St., Alameda, California.

JOSHUA FREEMAN left his old home on the Yadkin River, Siloam near Rockford, (the old County seat of Surry County) North Carolina about 1810. (See deeds in Surry Co. Recds.) He went with his daughter Temperance Freeman Grant, her children and others of the Grant-Freeman Family to Knox Co. Tenn. Settled near Knoxville, Tenn. where his dau.
