


Opening Word from the Pastor



The History of Dutton Baptist Church

On October1, 1921, a presbytery met to organize a Baptist Church at Dutton, Alabama. With a crisp, fall wind rippling the reds and yellows of the oaks and maples lining main street, the members settled into session on the second floor of The Institute Building, then used as the Dutton School.

Rev. S. Sparks was unanimously elected as moderator and Perry Horton was elected clerk. M. A. Johnson had already been notified to preach the ordination sermon. Others participating in the organizational meeting included Rev. J. T. Nichols who read the articles of faith, Rev. H. M. Garner to pray the ordination prayer, Rev. O. T. Perry to read the covenant and M. J. Frost to deliver the charge after the sermon by Brother Johnson, and prayer by Rev. J. T. Dean. A call for letters was issued and the following were examined and accepted: Rev. J. T. Dean, Brother John Clayton, J. A. Jenkins, E. L. Franklin, Andrew Green, Doc Green, Guss Duncan, George Pickett, Percy White, Colonel Green, sisters Ona Dean, Kate Franklin, Louise Franklin, Gartrell Gilbreath, Mary Nichols, Daisy Ray, Mattie Lee Duncan, Jane Smith, Sallie Green, Audie Green, Ola McKenzie, Lucy Duncan, Mrs. Clayton, and Lizzie Cowen. Rev. J. T. Nichols read the articles of faith to the candidates and the right hand of fellowship was extended to them. Rev. H. N. Garner, prayed the ordination prayer and the final charge was delivered by Rev. M. J. Frost. The covenant was read by O. T. Perry and was taken by the candidates after which they coveted with each other to keep it. On a motion the church was named Dutton Baptist Church. Upon motion, the minutes of the work of the Presbytery was read and received. Upon motion of the church the work was accepted and the Presbytery was released, after which the Presbytery declared them a duly constituted church.

After being duly declared a constituted church by the Presbytery, Dutton Baptist Church went into conference. On motion Rev. O. T. Perry was elected moderator protem and J. A. Jenkins, clerk. An opportunity for members was given and the following were received on the forth coming of letter: Dr. & Mrs. W. G. Stubbs, Mr. & Mrs. Pitman Clayton, Mrs. R. A. Nichols, and Allie White. Misses Pansy McCamon and Verna McLenzie came by experience and were baptized on Saturday at 2:30 p.m. The church elected to hold conferences on the second Saturday and meeting days were set for the second Sunday of the month.

Rev. J. T. Dean was elected as moderator for the next year and J. A. Jenkins was elected as clerk.

On September 9, 1922, the church met in regular conference and a motion was made to appoint a building committee. The committee was composed of J. T. Dilbeck, chairman, W. L. Stubbs, C. C. Bohannon, Isaac Williams, Kate Franklin and Allie White. The church building was constructed the following year on land donated by Mr. & Mrs. E. G. White. Several members donated lumber and labor for its construction.

In 1924, the church appointed a committee to raise money to paint the church. In 1925, the church hired someone to keep the church in order. They also took up a collection to pay for wood and to buy a light for the church. In April 1925, a motion was made for the deacons to have the windows stained. In October, 1925, the church sold lumber to help pay the church debts.

In September, 1926, the church voted to raise the pastor's salary to \$125.00.

In April, 1927, the church appointed a committee to rent land to grow cotton on, to help finance the church. At that time we had one of two Women's Missionary Societies in our Association.

The Deacons were asked to raise money for song books in August, 1930.

In 1934, the church hired a janitor to keep the church swept and to light the church at night.

During the church's 70 year existence, twenty-four men have served as its pastor. These included: Rev. J. T. Dean 1921-24, and 1933-34, Rev. W. B. Shirey 1924-33, Rev. M. L. Dean 1934-40, Rev. C. D. Rhodes 1940-43, Rev. Leon Nichols 1943-45 and Rev. Elbert Hicks 1945-51.

In 1945, our church held its first Vacation Bible School, with an enrollment of 92 children and workers. We did not have Vacation Bible School again until 1950. In the early years of VBS, people brought peanut butter glasses to drink from, since the church did not have the funds to buy paper products to use. Someone would take them home at night and wash them and bring them back the next day. Refreshments were served under the trees in the front of the church.

In 1951, Rev. Arnold Johnson became the church's first full time pastor. Under his leadership, the church established its first budget and built four new Sunday School rooms. Also in 1951, the church had its first RA and GA divisions, the RAs had an enrollment of 8 and the GAs had 12. In 1952, Rev. Roland Strawn became the pastor serving for two years. In 1954, the church chose Rev. Joe Campbell as pastor and he served until 1956. During his pastorate, a baptistery was constructed. Mr. & Mrs. John B. Ryan were the first two members baptized in it. Rev. Clifford Burgess served as pastor from 1956-57. In 1957, grades 1,4,5 and 6 of the Dutton School met in the church for seven months following a fire which destroyed the school. On September 1, 1957, John B. Ryan, John Smith, and Loyd Perry were ordained as deacons.

In 1958, the Brotherhood was organized and the church purchased *Broadman* Hymnals.

In 1959, the duties of the janitor were sweeping, dusting, filling the baptistery, and lighting the stove.

Other pastors have included Rev. Luther Anderson, 1957-60, Rev. Curtiss Sampley 1960-62, Rev. J.A. Linville 1962-64. During Rev. Sampley's pastorate. three more class rooms were added to the church at a cost of\$570.00 which the church paid in full. Later that year the church was painted for the cost of \$238.15 which the church also paid in full. In September, 1961, John B. Ryan was elected as chairman of the deacons and the church had a balance of \$168.89 in the treasury and debts of \$110.10. On November 4, 1962, the deacons recommended that a detailed report be given by the Sunday School department, the Training Union department, and the director of the WMU. Pauline Dilbeck was appointed treasure Pro Tem. On December 5, 1963, the church voted to change the business meeting from Sunday night to the first Wednesday night after the first Sunday of the month. In 1964, Rev. Duanne Johnson became the pastor and the church auditorium was refurbished under his leadership. Rev. Alton Janeway served as pastor in 1966 and during this time the church purchased a pastorium. Other pastors to date included: Rev. Percy Fuller 1967-68, Rev. Richard Blevins 1968-69, Rev. Rodney Yarbough 1969-71, Rev. L. D. Brookshire 1972.


In 1973, under the pastorate of Rev. C. T. Liverett a groundbreaking was held for the bricking of the church building.

Rev. M. J. (Buddy) Strickland served as pastor in 1974 and 75. Rev. Alton Janeway served as pastor again in 1976. Rev. Charles Smith was pastor in 1977 and the church started a bus ministry. In 1978 the church called Rev. Dale Haynes as their pastor. Under his leadership the church added a new fellowship hall, new Sunday School rooms and the auditorium was enlarged and renovated. The church also paved the parking lot and purchased the house and ground next to the church from the White family. The church has started several new ministries including: Tacobet, Hamon Home, and Children's Church. The church also added bigger bathrooms, a new nursery, new Sunday School rooms upstairs and a new sound room and a new sign ministry. Rev. Haynes left in 1996 and the church called Rev. Benny Evans, who has continued to improve the church with a new sound system and lots of plans for future growth.




