Mount Carmel Cemetery is located about five miles west of Bridgeport, Alabama on the hill overlooking the hamlet of Mt. Carmel and the old stage coach road, and lying between the Rocky Springs road on the east and the Orme, Tennessee road on the west. It consists of about ten acres of rolling ground, and at this time, it contains the graves of 1,447 persons. Eight hundred and forty of these have inscribed tomb stones; five hundred and fifty have only rough, natural limestone fragments as markers: and as many as fifty can be identified only by rectangular depressions in the ground.

From the evidence now available, it appears that this hill was occupied by a church and cemetery dating as far back as the first settlements in this part of Alabama about the time the state was admitted to the Union in 1819. It's story reflects the common interest of these earliest settlers, in the importance of providing a place of worship, with grounds for the burial of their dead, just as soon as possible after securing to themselves their most elementary needs of shelter, food and clothing.

The frequency of small neighborhood churches and cemeteries, within distances of a few miles from each other, further emphasized the spiritual need and reveals the overwhelming difficulty of travel in those days of impassable roads and primitive vehicles. Even these numerous bases were not always accessible or perhaps acceptable to every family. As a result, such families sometime laid out private burial grounds on their own lands, as small cemeteries here and there testify.

The denomination of each local church was determined by the major religious persuasion of the neighborhood and its potential for converts. It was not unusual for the church to be used as a school house for a few months of the year.

The Mt. Carmel complex, within the present cemetery, seems to have typified this early arrangement according to the memory of some of the oldest citizens of the community. One of these described the first church as a small one-room log structure with a limestone chimney and a huge fireplace that occupied the greater part of one end of the building. It was situated on the ground where the walled-in Gunter lot and the Jenkins lots now lie. The property was owned by the Methodist Church. It was serviced by circuit riding ministers and it was used for school three months each summer. While this informant was a member of a Baptist family, she did not attend church services there but she was a pupil in the summer School which was held in the church building.

She remembers the names of her teachers and the fact that they were paid \$20 per month for their work. Several

other references reported that they had always understood that the immediate property was originally owned by the Methodist church. No one, however, could tell when the church was built. Two items of mute testimony raise conjecture supporting both the presence of the church and the use of the adjacent land as burial ground. First, the three earliest graves in the cemetery are those of:

Daniel Price who died August 25, 1833

Berry Johnson who died October 10, 1855

Jerry Clemens Gunter who died March 14, 1856

All of these men were buried within close range of the alleged church site, thus indicating its planned use as a cemetery.

Second is the fact that one of the earliest settlers in Bridgeport, Augustus Gunter, a lay Methodist preacher made regular trips on horseback to hold services within the circuit and he may have served this church. Certainly the above Jerry Clemens was his son who was buried at the cemetery site at an early date. This, too, possibly foreshadowed the interest of his other three sons in their later development there. In 1894, they interred the body of Augustus Gunter in the alleged churchyard.

After the three burials mentioned above the inscribed tombstones reveal a decrease in the popularity of the cemetery as a burial ground for about twenty years. It could be that interment continued without the use of inscribed markers, but any identity by name and date is lost in oblivion.

It may be assumed that the old church became inadequate during this time and was abandoned, possibly demolished, as no further evidence of its existence can be found.

In 1887, the three remaining sons of Augustus Gunter, W. M., R. C., and John H. purchased the rectangular piece of land extending from the road on the west to a landmark on the eastern slope toward the Rocky Springs road and from the back fence, on the north, to a point lying between the Ollie Brazell and the James L. Lee lots and extending across the full length of the cemetery. At the time of purchase the lower line across the cemetery was marked by heavy cedar posts which have since disappeared.

On the eastern side of this ground facing the main road they had a church building erected and equipped with the standard pews and altar pieces. When this was ready for services in 1888, they dedicated it for the use of all denominations, as the community had various religious sects without a church building at that time. The remainder of the ground was opened for free burial to the public, with this one exception--that the church yard, which was well marked, should forever be the burial ground for the Gunter family and their descendants.

Following this date, the cemetery filled in rapidly all across the top of the hill, as the recorded dates on the tombstones indicate. Doubtlessly many others who could not be counted because of a lack of identification, were also buried there during this period.

About 1896, the citizens of Mt. Carmel built a one-room frame school house on the ground just east of the old church site. The pupils of the community attended school for three months of the year, and one teacher taught all the grades for many years.

By 1908, the Baptist population had increased until they were ready to build a church for themselves. Their services in the church for all denominations then terminated, and they erected the Mt. Carmel Baptist Church on the slope facing the cemetery hill.

In the early 1920's, Edward Loyd, undertaker in Bridgeport, inherited his share of the Crownover estate contiguous to the cemetery and began selling lots from his property. Thus, there began a sprinkling of graves below the free cemetery line and toward the main road.

About 1921, the Pelham Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy of Bridgeport placed iron crosses, symbolizing Confederate Military service, on each known Confederate Veteran's grave. When the cemetery was cleared recently, it was found that some veterans were not included, as their identity had not been made known to the U D C Chapter.

After several years, Mr. Loyd moved his family to California, and the sale of his cemetery lots was carried on by his brothers-in-law, Robert Parton and J. B. Beck, Sr. The number of graves seems to have increased equally in both the free and public grounds.

By 1921, the student population in the Mt. Carmel precinct had outgrown the one-room school building in the cemetery, and the need for more space was met that year by the building of a three-room frame school house on the ground, across the main road, near the section houses. The school and the section houses may now still be seen there. Three teachers were then employed to teach nine grades. This was the arrangement until school consolidation became effective, and the pupils were transported by school buses to the Bridgeport school.

In the winter of 1951-52, the church for all denominations in the cemetery burned to the ground. The pews and the altar pieces were saved and were later borrowed by the Church of Christ in Doran's Cove and Abbotts Chapel in Bridgeport. After a few years, the Doran's Cove church purchased new pews and returned the old ones to the Gunter heirs, in care of Mrs. Flossie Carmichael. A few months later, L H. Hughes requested that these pews be used in a new Negro Church of Christ in Bridgeport, where they are still in use today. The Abbotts Chapel is still using about eighteen of the pews that they borrowed. The pulpit however has never been returned. If it is in use by any church, then that is where it should be.

With no more church attendance, interest on the hill

waned and as time passed, both the church site and the cemetery yielded to the wilderness which finally covered the earth except for a few small clearings, with a dense tangle of trees, bushes, and vines obscuring hundreds of graves. Over many years about all that was visible was a clean spot here and there in a wilderness marked by rough eroded earth, sunken graves and decades of accruing natural debris.

About 1954, the Mt. Carmel Home Demonstration Club adopted as their work project, a plan to clear the cemetery grounds. They worked hard for two years and made a remarkable showing by clearing a great stretch of ground and bringing hundreds of graves into the open. This work continued for two years and by then a shortage of workers brought it to an end. The labor was not entirely lost, however, for its results did not end with its duration, but much of it was of great help when the next clearing began.

Twelve years elapsed before any further attempt at a general cleanup was begun. This lapse of time with the help of sun and rain, which could now fall directly upon much of the ground, induced a heavier growth than before. Realizing the necessity of an overall plan for the reclamation of the entire cemetery, a group of concerned women met in the Community Center in Bridgeport on March 29, 1966 and formed the organization known as the Mt. Carmel Cemetery Association. The purpose of this organization was to restore, improve, and preserve the entire cemetery in a way consistent with the deserved dignity of such a sanctuary. Rules were adopted at this meeting and potential members were solicited.

In April following the organization of the Association, work began with a set goal. Every week day until late fall it continued, and the result was a complete clearance of the overgrowth, the removal of several of the most dilapidated pens from graves and completion of two rough mowings. Since that time, work has been continuous three seasons of the year and the plan includes permanent care. Every foot of the cemetery is now visible.

By this time the Edward Loyd portion of the cemetery was in possession of Messers John Hall and Payne brothers, who had purchased it from Mr. Loyd's widow. During the summer of 1966, they cleared the area lying between the old cemetery and the main road and they seeded the ground with grass. This improved the setting tremendously as it opened the view from the top of the hill to the road.

In the same year, the members of the Baptist Church, after hearing that their property might be included with a state highway plan, secured the right to build on the exact site as the church that had burned. With deep devotion, loyalty and hard work, they built a beautiful edifice which gives a commanding dignity to the hill and community. This church building was dedicated in 1967 and is now in constant use. Much credit is due those faithful members who gave unsparingly of their time, labor and money toward the realization of this church.

On May 28, 1968, the Cemetery Association called a meeting for the purpose of organizing a policy forming board to serve as a base of authority for the association's performance. Mrs. Flossie Carmichael acted as temporary chairman and Mrs. John Tanner served as temporary secretary. A board was organized as follows:

John R. Gunter- President
Lewis Payne- Vice-President
Mrs. John Tanner - Secretary
John Hall -Member
G. C. Barham - Member
Robert Littlejohn - Member

During the meeting, the board approved a plan to end the practice of free burial in the old cemetery and to charge \$37.50, a price compatible with other community cemeteries for individual graves. Plans were discussed for increasing and paving roads within the cemetery to make all parts of it accessible by ambulance and trucks carrying vaults and other grave materials. An appropriate entrance to the cemetery was approved with plans to be submitted later. At the meeting, the Board approved the central control of both cemeteries; the privately owned part and the public portion applying the same rules to both.

With a view to a system that would secure a plan of permanent care and improvement of the grounds. The formation of a corporation was set for investigation.

Late in 1968, a complete roster of the graves lying in Mt. Carmel cemetery was made. It is regrettable that so many of them have no marker to tell the simple story that they were born, died and were buried there. It is gratifying, on the contrary, that since the cemetery has emerged from its wilderness of obscurity, relatives are adding markers continually. Many of the dead will never be known because even the living relatives have disappeared, but it is hoped that most of them will finally bear an inscription of identity.

Separate rosters were made of the men who served our country in the different wars. All lists accompany this report.

March 29 will be the fourth anniversary of the Mt. Carmel Cemetery Association. A letter with a copy of this story and the roster of the dead will be sent to each member by that date.

Most of this story is written in retrospect about facts gathered from many sources. If they appear a little cloudy in places, be assured that much effort was made in an attempt to confirm them. The difficulty lies as has been said in the lapse of time and the lack of written word or records of the earliest years.

The prospects for future care and improvement are evident in the slope of activity outlined by the cemetery association and the board.

The reward for the work involved in these activities

lies in the pleasure of participation.

On March 29, 1966, a small group of persons interested in the improvement and taking care of the Mount Carmel Cemetery met at the Bridgeport Civic Center for the purpose of forming an organization which would be permanent and belong to the members to maintain the Mount Carmel cemetery on and on.

Mrs. Flossie Gunter Carmichael was chosen to act as chairman of this meeting and Mrs. Jewell Tanner presented the following resolution:

"Resolved, that it is the sense of this meeting that an Association should now be formed for the purpose of improving and maintaining the Mount Carmel cemetery in a way that is keeping with its sanctity."

At this meeting, a set of By-Laws was read and adopted and the following officers were elected: President, Flossie Carmichael; Vice President, Jewell Tanner; Secretary, Georgie Cox; Treasurer, Frances Lee.

Mrs. Katherine Walker was appointed to serve as chairman of the Membership Committee and those added to the Planning Committee were Dee Payne, John Hall, Walter Raulston, Mrs. Esther Williams Loyd and Mrs. Bessie Williams Young. A membership fee was set by the Association to help maintain the grounds. Annual meetings were to be held on or near Memorial Day each year.

By July 23, 1966, much of the wild tangled undergrowth had been cleared from the grounds by voluntary efforts. The Bridgeport National Guardsmen, under the direction of Ralph Abbott, Captain, did some work during this time such as removal of stumps, leveling mounds of dirt and filling in sunken graves. Leaning markers were set up and much debris was removed from the cemetery. Among the pioneer contributors were the following: The Home Demonstration Club of Mt. Carmel and their assistants, Flossie Gunter Carmichael, Gunter descendants, The Boyd descendants, Robert Littlejohn, Walter and Willie Mae Raulston, John and Jewell Tanner, Georgia Cox, Frances Lee, John A. Hall, Edgar Carroll, Lewis Payne, the J. R. Loyd family, Esther Williams Loyd, Iva Nell Hurt Ricker, Winnie Farr Rowe and many survivors.

In the spring of 1967, John Hall, W. D. Payne and Lewis Payne cleared the portion of the cemetery between the old cemetery and the main road. This portion of the cemetery was previously owned by Ed Loyd who was the undertaker at Bridgeport for many years before retiring and moving to California.

A Baptist church building was erected on the exact site where the community church building had burned in the year of 1951. This new building was dedicated in 1967, and the Mount Carmel Cemetery Association have been holding their

annual meetings in the auditorium of the new building since May 30, 1968.

Mrs. Flossie Gunter Carmichael served as president of the Mt. Carmel Cemetery Association from March 19, 1966 until her death on January 1, 1972. On Saturday, July 1, 1972, was a day for cleaning and improving the cemetery. This day of work was a tribute to Mrs. Carmichael, past president for six years, who spent the last few years of her life in making a better shaped and beautiful memorial garden.

Edgar Carroll served as president of the Association for four years. Being elected April 29, 1972 and serving until April 11, 1986. Mr. Carroll was highly praised for the work accomplished while he was president. On April 26, 1989, Mr. Carroll passed away and was buried in the Stevenson cemetery in Stevenson, Alabama.

Edgar's parents and a brother are buried in the Mount Carmel cemetery.

Robert Littlejohn was elected president on April 11, 1986. Mr. Littlejohn and his son, Bobby, along with volunteers spent hours working in the cemetery.

Walter Raulston joined Robert and John Hall with many volunteers in continuing of the improvement and care of the cemetery.

Mr. Littlejohn served as president until May 21, 1989.

Ralph Leroy was elected President on May 21, 1989 and served until the new Board of Directors were elected.

Mr. Leroy was praised for his effort, time spent and hard work that he had contributed to the upkeep of the cemetery.

Pledges were made by some of the members toward purchasing a Certificate of Deposit to be used in setting up a Perpetual Fund. As of December 1990, the Perpetual Fund had increased to a little over \$18,000. The following contributed five hundred to one thousand dollars to the Perpetual Fund: Mona Ridley McKissick, Rachel Walker Green, Wm. Charles Thompson, Jr., J. Ralph Ridley, Sr., J. Ralph Ridley, Jr., Vaughn Troxell, Argyl and Addie Sue Grider Martha Boyd Stewart, Coleman Boyd, T. C. Stewart, Elizabeth Gross Harris, Lillian McCampbell Wilson.

Mrs. Rachel Walker Green, who owned the land back of the cemetery, gave permission to make a one lane driveway on this land. Mrs. Green gave the Association a deed for 12 x 1000 feet of land. This deed has been recorded and a road opened up so now one can drive around the cemetery.

At a special meeting, September 16, 1990, the members voted and approved that the Mount Carmel Cemetery Association become an Incorporated Organization consisting of a Board of Directors and the Organization be a Non-Profit Organization.

At this meeting, the money was raised to purchase the land below the road. The following contributed five hundred dollars or more for the purchasing of the land: Rachel Walker Green, Bobby Rich, Harold Grider, John and Joan Bevel, Alvin and Lena Cagle, T. C. Stewart, Lewis Payne, Vaughn Troxell, Ralph Ridley, Sr., Cobb and Emily Hall, Robert and Lillian Littlejohn, Clarence Mathis, Walter Raulston estate, and John A. Tanner estate.

The Articles of Incorporation of Mount Carmel Cemetery, Inc. (a non-profit corporation) was signed on October 10, 1990, and the Certificate of Incorporation issued on October 12, 1990.

At a special meeting held on December 2, 1990, the following were elected to serve on the Board of Directors: Thomas L. Rorex, John Cobb Hall, John Bevel, Ralph Ridley, Lewis Payne, Alvin Cagle, John Gunter and Ralph Leroy.

The Board of Directors elected their officers as follows:

First Vice-President John C. Hall
Second Vice-President John Gunter
Secretary John Bevel
Treasurer Alvin Cagle

Ben L. Hill III was selected as Attorney and Advisory of the Board and a new set of By-Laws was adopted.

Finance Committee - Willie Mae Raulston, Alvin Cagle and Tommy Rorex.

History and Book Committee - Georgia Cox, Fay Hale, Lena Cagle and Lillian Wilson.

Publicity Committee - Jewell Tanner, Georgia Cox, Fay Hale, Lena Cagle, Lillian Wilson, Elizabeth Gross Harris, Willie Mae Raulston, Vaughn Troxell, Ralph Leroy, Ralph Ridley, Estelle Cureton, Lena Lee Hawkins, and Robert Littlejohn.

Long Range Planning Committee - Cobb Hall, John Bevel, Alvin Cagle, Lena Cagle, Ralph Leroy, Jewell Tanner, Willie Mae Raulston, Gordon Leroy and Tommy Rorex.

Maintenance Committee - Ralph Leroy, Cobb Hall, Bobby Rich, Hope Graham, Gordon Leroy and Jimmy Cox.

The following volunteer workers spent more than one hundred hours helping to achieve the goals of the cemetery: Ralph Leroy, Tommy and Patsy Rorex, Alvin and Lena Cagle, Georgia Cox, Frances Lee, Fay Ridley Hale, Jewell Tanner Willie Mae Raulston, Bobby Rich, John and Joan Bevel and

Lillian McCampbell Wilson.

All progress of Mount Carmel Cemetery, Incorporated has been made by volunteers. No portion of contributions have gone to the services of the Board of Directors or chairman of committees.

Accomplishments - 1990

\$20,000.00 was raised and the cemetery was purchased. A road at the back of the cemetery was partially built and improvements were made to driveways within the cemetery.

The cemetery was mowed, cleaned and trimmed during the spring, summer and fall. The grounds were improved, many stumps were removed, roots were picked up and hauled off, sunken graves were filled, some monuments were reset and grass was planted. Regarding the road that was constructed at the back of the cemetery, it may be used but is not completed at the present time. Part of the work on the road was done free of charge by Bobby Rich and Ralph Leroy.

One parking area was made available by the side of the central driveway.

A financial plan was approved by the Board of Directors. Alvin Cagle is serving as Treasurer.

The address list has been updated. Local newspapers have graciously printed information about the cemetery.

Robert Littlejohn has repainted and remounted two out-dated signs.

Accomplishments -1991

The accomplishments of 1991 are unexcelled due to the cooperation, the hard work, the appreciation and the contributions of many.

We finally became a tax-exempt and tax-deductible organization.

The cemetery was cleared and mowed six times.

Some repair work was done on driveways. The land for future graves was mowed (or bushhogged) by volunteers.

Contributions were received by the Treasurer. Receipts were given for each. An accurate record kept of expenditures for improvements and upkeep. A plat of 734 graves was made and recorded. Marble posts were placed to identify sections. Each grave plot is numbered. A deed will be given for each plot bought. The purchaser may have the deed recorded.

Much correspondence was necessary for answering letters for

people who live away from the community.

The address list has been made more complete. Much research and organization for the history of the cemetery has been done in preparation for a book.

Accomplishments -1992

Continued unfinished work of prior years.

Marble corner markers were placed at each section on the plat.

A new flag was donated to replace the worn one.

Many have cleaned their plots, bagged debris and carried it away from the cemetery.

Some have washed monuments, reset tilted and fallen monuments and filled sunken graves.

Some have hauled bagged flowers and debris by the truck load from the cemetery.

One hundred two have paid dues. Every person received a receipt for payment.

Seven graves have been sold. A deed for each was given.

Six letters of inquiry have been answered.

Mowing was done six times at the cost of \$425.00 amounting to a total of \$2,550.00. Bushing work was volunteered.

Financial report was given at the annual meeting on May 24, 1992.

Accurate minutes were read at the annual meeting.

The publicity committee had an article and pictures of the cemetery in the North Alabama Electric Cooperative magazine.

Three hundred and seventy two letters were mailed to survivors, relatives, friends and community members.

Grave plots were advertised in the North Jackson Progress newspaper.

The sign at the entrance of the cemetery has been painted.

Reports were made to maintain our status at a tax-exempt and tax-deductible organization.

Many hours have been spent getting information for the history of the cemetery and organizing for the book.

Volunteers typed letters and used copiers to duplicate the number of letters needed. This was donated work.

Sixteen persons were buried in 1992.

Twenty six letters were written and mailed in response to memorials given.

Three hundred letters have been written seeking information for the roster of graves.



LONG TIME GOALS

1. Improve the driveways.
2. Build the perpetual care fund to support a caretaker the year around.
3. Make a concrete wall at the lower west side to hold soil. (The one by the Clyde Raulston graves is a good pattern.)
4. Continue the sale of graves.
5. The border of the cemetery land purchased in 1990 should be identified and marked.
6. Make a landscape plan and include a drawing in one of the future annual letters so all can help.
7. Consult legal authority for a plan to sell unmarked graves in the old cemetery area without records. Then proceed.
8. Solve the problem of monuments out-of-line, sunken graves, holes, and severely irregular ground.
9. Every interested person help do the necessary chores to make the cemetery a place of pride.
10. As people are buried, add names to your roster of graves included in the book.
11. When the book is finished, show it to survivors. Help sell for interest and profit for cemetery improvements.

If you have suggestions for raising money, please let it be known at the annual meetings. These are ideas so far:

1. Contribute. It is tax deductible
2. Make a C.D. payable to the Mount Carmel Cemetery, Incorporated.



KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, the undersigned incorporators, all being residents of Jackson County, Alabama, and all being over the age of nineteen (19) years do hereby join in the execution of these Articles of Incorporation for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation pursuant to the terms and provisions of Section 10-3-1 through 10-3-72, inclusive of the Code of Alabama (1975), and do each join in the execution of these Articles for the purpose of forming and becoming a body corporate pursuant to the provisions of law.

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be:

MOUNT CARMEL CEMETERY, INC.

ARTICLE II

The term of existence of the Corporation is perpetual; and the Corporate existence will commence on the filing of these Articles in the Probate Office for Jackson County, Alabama.

ARTICLE III

The primary objective of the Corporation shall be for the ownership, maintenance, care and beneficial use of Mount Carmel Cemetery in Bridgeport, Alabama or such other purposes as is authorized by law. This non-profit corporation is formed exclusively for charitable, civic and cultural purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954; and notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles or the By-Laws of this Corporation, this Corporation will not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a Corporation exempt from Federal Income Tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law, or by a corporation to which contributions are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or any other corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

ARTICLE IV

There shall be two (2) members of the initial Board of Directors of the Corporation. The names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as directors until the first election thereof are as follows:

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
of
MOUNT CARMEL CEMETERY INCORPORATION

DATED
DECEMBER 2, 1990

ARTICLE I

NAME AND PURPOSE

- Section I The name of this organization shall be Mount Carmel Cemetery, Incorporation.
- Section II The purpose of this corporation shall be to provide improvements and perpetual care for the Mount Carmel Cemetery, Incorporation.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP

- Section I Membership in the Cemetery Incorporation shall be open to all.
(a) Survivors of family members or relatives who are buried there.
(b) To all who own burial plots there.
(c) To any individuals who have an interest in the Cemetery.
- Section II Members shall be expected to pay dues of \$25.00 per year.
- Section III Any member shall have the right to vote to participate in meetings and to hold office in the Mount Carmel Cemetery, Incorporation.
- Section IV Any member shall participate by submitting suggestions in writing to any of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE III

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section I The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than three or more than eight.

- Section II The Board of Directors shall appoint a chairman of each standing Committee. Each Chairman submit the names of two or more to form the Committee.
- Section III The Board of Directors shall fill any vacancy occurring on the Board from candidates presented by the nominating committee.
- Section IV The Board of Directors shall meet as deemed necessary to transact business.
- Section V Retired Board members shall become honorary members of the Board of Directors.
- Section VI Notice of all meetings of the Board of Directors both called and annual shall be given by the Secretary.

ARTICLE IV

MEETINGS

- Section I (a) There shall be only one meeting of all members per annually unless the President of the Board deems it necessary to call additional meetings.
(b) The Board of Directors will meet as needs arise and business justify.
- Section II The time of the annual meeting will be around Memorial Day, the exact time and date to be decided by the Chairman of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V

FUNDS

- Section I Dues shall of necessity be used for maintenance.
- Section II Contributions for the Perpetual Care Fund shall be accumulative until such fund is sufficient to meet continuous care and improvement.
- Section III Money from the sale of grave plots and any other money made for the cemetery and contributions for improvements is to be managed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI

MANAGEMENT

Section I Roberts Rules of Order revised shall govern the order of Mount Carmel Cemetery Incorporation.

ARTICLE VII



CHURCH BUILDING BUILT BY GUNTER BROTHERS IN YEAR
OF 1888 DESTROYED BY FIRE ON DECEMBER 23, 1951.

**Church Edifice Erected By Gunter Brothers
In Year 1888 Burns to Ground December 23**

The congregation had met to hear Brother Charles Holder as their mothers and fathers had done in 1910, just 41 years ago. It was Sunday, December 23, and the weather was fair but rather chilly. As the church-goers of the Mt. Carmel Community wended their way up the hill to the little white church that had stood as a landmark for 63 years their thoughts were of days gone by when they held the father's guiding hand.

If these daughters and sons of the pioneers who settled this peaceful community could have given audible expression to their thoughts on this yuletide day we have every reason to believe it would have been a wish that those who blazed the trail could be present on that last stroll to the meeting house built by Gunter Brothers in the year 1888, just 63 years ago. But they silently went on as they listened to the congregational singing of songs that have lived down through the annals of time to brighten hope and strengthen faith.

As the late-comers entered they heard Brother Charles Holder, a very great man of God, as he read lengthily from the 6th chapter of the book of Matthew's gospel. The tall minister whose locks were dark when he began preaching there 41 years ago but which have turned white with the years, was reading the 33 verse: "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you."

Noting uneasiness on the part of his listeners, and having himself observed sparks of fire floating

through the room, the speaker's voice was stilled for a moment. He leaned over to hear what John Crownover, a member of the congregation had to say to him in a whisper. It was this: "Brother Holder, the house is on fire."

By this time many had rushed from the congregation to the church-house yard only to see the age-old, shingled roof ablaze. One of the congregation climbed a tree and was in the act of jumping to the roof where he hoped to wipe out the flames, but more seasoned judgment decreed that he stop where he was and he came back to safety.

Having stood the blasts of many winters and the heat of as many summers, the edifice had become a number one fire hazard. The stove pipe had rusted and rotted at the point where it entered a faulty brick chimney, and these conditions are attributed to the disaster which might otherwise have been avoided.


**CHURCH GIVEN TO MT. CAR-
MEL COMMUNITY BY

There were three brothers who lived at Bridgeport, Ala., nearby.


They were John, Cal and C. Gunter. These were prominent business men who had acquired much wealth in the operation of steamboats on the Tennessee river. They had succeeded in the business world and wanted, it would seem, to do something for humanity. They fell on the idea of building a meeting house at Mt. Carmel. The people at the time had no place to worship. The community was made up of Methodists, Baptists, the Church of Christ and possibly in herents to other religious persuasions. They set out to build these people a house in which to worship and when it was finished they placed a sign on the front which read: "Erected by Gunter Brothers in 1888 for all denominations."

Strangely enough, Brother Holder who preached the last sermon, or shall we say part of a sermon, in the community church tells us that when he entered the church yard on that morning so fateful to the works of love on the part of the Gunter boys, he looked up and read the words placed there 63 years ago. "Somehow," Brother holder told this scribe, "the words had a deeper meaning to me than ever before."

So far as the writer knows at the time, there are now living only two of the children of the Gunter family. They are Mrs. Pearl Gunter Gay, daughter of John Gunter and she lives at Scottsboro, Ala. The other is Mrs. C. C. Boyd, widow of the late Coleman Boyd. She owns her home in Bridgeport but for the present is sojourning in Florida, the land of sunshine and flowers together with her daughter.

In year 1954 a dozen women members of Mt. Carmel Home Demonstration Club, chose the Mt. Carmel cemetery as their project for the year.

This was a great undertaking because of the size and condition of the cemetery, so great, in fact, this is still our project, (4 years later).

The Mt. Carmel cemetery covers about 10 acres atop a rolling hill in mouth of Doran's Cove. The majority of cemetery had been neglected until it was nothing short of a wilderness. Fallen trees,


briers, under brush, grape vine and growing trees, some growing from graves were a shameful sight, and to most an impossibility. But with their determination and faith that it could be done, we went to work. Contacting every one possible that had an interest in cemetery.

From free will contributions, cedar posts, eats and drings sold at annual workings we netted approximately \$450.00. in 3 years. From the timber on cemetery \$350.00 or there about.

This money has been used for labor on cemetery, besides a great amount of free labor given by men, women and children from surrounding communities. We the Mt. Carmel Home Demonstration Club wish to express our appreciation and say "Thanks" to each one that has helped in so great an undertaking. Had it not been for you, we could not have accomplished this.

Our funds are now completely exhausted — please lets not let our cemetery get back in condition of 1954. In present state one man can cut (with sling blade) entire cemetery, within 3 weeks. Now folk its up to you — lets keep it clean. Send donations to. or see Mrs. Gordon Sebring, Bridgeport, Ala.

Incorporation improves Mount Carmel

For about 10 years, the Mount Carmel Cemetery Association struggled to provide maintenance to the grounds that serve as a resting place for loved ones of the Sequatchie Valley.



Now, the association has incorporated, thus improving the service the new Mount Carmel Cemetery, Inc. provides in this regard.

"Only a week ago, we removed a lot of stumps from the front section of the cemetery. This will clear the way for new plots," said Tommy Rorex, president of the association.

Rorex joined in the efforts about a year ago, lending his expertise in helping the association achieve incorporation. He quickly points out that others, like Jewell Tanner, have given years of dedicated service toward improving the cemetery, located just a few miles outside Bridgeport.

"She's worked her socks off on this," lauds Rorex.

Last Feb. 24, members of the Board of Directors and Committees met in a planning session. There, members accepted job assignments for clearing land,

planting grass, restoring monuments, and arranging methods for selling new plots. Goals also call for creation of a booklet detailing each grave in the cemetery.

"We made a list of grave monuments needing repair and found that about 90 needed minor repair," Rorex says. "Judging from that, I'd say there are probably 600 to 700 graves in the cemetery."

In the older sections, burials occurred as early as the latter half of the 1800s. Through neglect, graves and gravestones had become obscured through growth of weeds and exposure to the elements.

But, through the efforts of the association, many improvements have already taken place. Rorex explains that fundraising efforts are going well.

"Over about a three-month period we raised \$20,000 with which to purchase seven acres of land," he notes.

"We have since purchased the land, most of which is along the front of the cemetery behind the flag pole. We've also bought land to the right side as you drive up the hill toward Mount Carmel Baptist Church."

Willie Mae Raulston is just one more person helping out.

"I just have been sending cards and helping get letters out to relatives of those buried there," Raulston says. "Every year, we send out letters, usually in April, seeking donations."

"The money we've raised thus far has almost entirely come from private sources," Rorex declares.

Many persons have donated \$500- and \$1,000-gifts, according to Rorex. Those who have contributed such generous amounts will have their names placed on a plaque to honor contributors.






The above picture shows the walled-in Gunter lot.



Graves shown inside the Gunter lot.









LAMBERT PLACES VETERANS STONES IN CEMETERY

James D. Lambert, Jr. began placing veterans stones in 1992, after doing research on his family name. The first three stones placed were in Cherokee County, Ala. These stones were for his third great grandfather, James M. Lambert, his son William P. Lambert and his nephew Seth Hampton Lambert II, all of which were in the Confederate service during the civil war. James's interest in genelological research began as a child when he accompanied his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Alfred M. Lambert, Sr., on a trip to Chattanooga, Tenn. to visit Alfreds brother, Eric Deward Lambert. After sitting and listening to the two men recollect about their grandparents and growing up, along with other family history, the spark to learn more ignited a flame of wanting to learn and research more about his family history. It is this one trip to Chattanooga, that has led to the erection of nearly 150 Confederate, Union and Indian war veterans stones. The late Alfred M. Lambert, Sr. should receive most of the recognition for unintentionally kindling an interest in his grandson, that has burned out of control ever since.

As for the nearly 150 stones placed, 42 are at Mount Carmel Cemetery near Bridgeport. It is at this cemetery that the late Alfred M. Lambert, Sr. is interned after passing from this life on December 28, 1989.

Mount Carmel Cemetery contains the graves of Many with a history worth studying; the graves of veterans of old wars make a very interesting type of research. It is some of the graves that James Dennis Lambert, Jr. has been researching and marking with veterans stones. So far 42 veterans have been marked, of which 39 are Confederate, 8 of them are "In Memory Of". Also marked are a Union veteran, a World War I, and an Indian War veteran grave.

The Indian War grave is that of Berry Johnson, who fought in the Florida War. This stone was placed with the assistance of F. Marion Loyd, who is a descendent of Mr. Johnson.

Mount Carmel Cemetery contains the majority of graves marked by Mr. Lambert of the 25 cemeteries that have received markers. These cemeteries are located in Jackson, Dekalb, Cherokee Counties in Alabama and Marion County, Tennessee. Mr. Lambert plans to continue his research and mark any graves he identifies through his research.
