INTRODUCTION

This work is dedicated, with grateful appreciation, to our families and our many friends and neighbors who have supplied us with information and directions to long-forgotten burial places. Some of them have personally taken us in trucks and four-wheel drive vehicles to cemeteries located in now inaccessible areas.

We have included every known burial place in this beautiful valley from the Keel Cemetery located atop Keel Mountain near Paint Rock to the Beech Grove Cemetery in Francisco at the Tennessee line and to the Pratt-Carlton Cemetery which is ten miles inside Franklin County, Tennessee at the head of Estill Creek and to the Clark Cemetery at the head of Hurricane Creek near the Walls of Jericho.

We have climbed over and crawled under barbed-wire fences, climbed hills, waded creeks, braved the heat, cold, rain, mud, honeysuckle vines, sawbriars and snakes to record this information before it is forever lost to time, man, and the elements.

To our great sorrow, there are many, many graves in this pioneer area that are marked by fieldstones only. We have attempted to record these unmarked graves by contacting family descendants. Some families are now erecting stones in memory of their loved ones.

There are numerous rocked-up box type tombs made of native stones. These are commonly called "Indian" graves but we have found many families who used this type tomb but were not of Indian heritage so we feel this is just a carry-over from the early Indian burial customs.

Great care has been taken in copying these tombstones but some of them are quite old and the engraving almost worn away and there will inevitably be mistakes. Please notify us of any errors and we will be happy to correct them in a book on the general history of Paint Rock Valley which we plan to print within a couple of years.

This data, other than the tombstone inscriptions, has been obtained from Federal census records, Jackson County Probate records, newspaper obituaries and old family Bibles.

KEEL CEMETERY (KEEL MOUNTAIN)

This cemetery is located in Township 4 South, Range 3 East, Section 30 on the McKinney Farm on Keel Mountain.

There are eight graves enclosed with a wrought iron fence, with unmarked fieldstones at each grave. A common marker was placed on the site in 1970 by Keel descendants with the names of those they knew were buried here:

GARNER GRAVEYARD

This cemetery is located in Township 5, Range 3E, Section 4, about two miles southeast of Paint Rock, 300-400 yards to the right of Highway 72E. It is encircled by trees but was fairly clean on the inside. Numerous graves here are marked only by native fieldstones. There are ten rocked-up tombs, the type of grave very prevalent in the older cemeteries in Paint Rock Valley, especially prior to 1880.

We copied this cemetery April 7, 1984 and at that time could find no inscriptions. We did find the base to one bought tombstone but could not locate the tombstone. It is probably that of:

This was recorded by Ola Johnson, Decatur, Alabama, on a trip to this cemetery in 1967.

AN UNNAMED CEMETERY AT PAINT ROCK

This cemetery, located Township 4 South, Range 3 East, Section 34 near the mouth of Kennamer Hollow, has been completely abandoned. There is much undergrowth and cedar trees but there are still remains of seven or eight box-type tombs.

Owners of the property state that years ago there was a tombstone for a small child, Mary Ann Redman, who died at the age of about fourteen months. Once while visiting the cemetery site on their farm, they found a small, old-fashioned leather shoe about three inches long, evidently that of a small child. Perhaps Mary Ann Redman?

One hand-carved stone has the following dates but no names. Evidently this marked the graves of two children and is one of the very oldest stones found in the Paint Rock Valley area:

This cemetery, located in Township 4 South, Range 3 East, Section 32, 1 mile south of Paint Rock in Webb Hollow, has many unmarked graves. The only tombstone is that of:

We do not know the descendants of any of the daughters but a son, John B. Anderson, born about 1851, married Mary Wilhelm and they have many descendants in the North Alabama area. Rousseau, daughter of Martha and John Rousseau, on 3 October, 1873, and later settled in the West, possibly in the Boswell, Oklahoma area.

PAINT ROCK CEMETERY

This cemetery which is currently in use by the town of Paint Rock is located in Township 4 South, Range 3 East, Section 32. It was started when Old Paint Rock #2 (Woodmen of the World) cemetery proved to be too low and had to be abandoned. The earliest tombstone is that of John Daniel Smith who was buried April 16, 1920. Mary C. (Tipton) Davis was buried September 5 of that same year.

JONATHAN C. CAMP CEMETERY

Located Township 4 South, Range 3 East, Section 20, about one mile north of Paint Rock, approximately 100 yards off Highway 72 East, this land was entered by Jonathan Camp 29 September, 1832 and is now owned by Roy B. Whitaker, Sr. Mr. Whitaker states that there are about fifteen graves here - no tombstones or markers existing.

Mr. Whitaker also states that he has been told a soldier was buried here. We have found no evidence of Jonathan Camp being a soldier; however, Sarah Camp, widow of Bird Camp, received 80 acres bounty land in the Paint Rock River Bridge area as a result of Bird Camp's service during the Florida War. She immediately assigned the land to Jonathan C. Camp who was more than likely her son.

Bird Camp was a private in Capt. Pruitt's Company, Alabama Volunteers in the Florida War and had died before 1850, so possibly he is the soldier buried here.

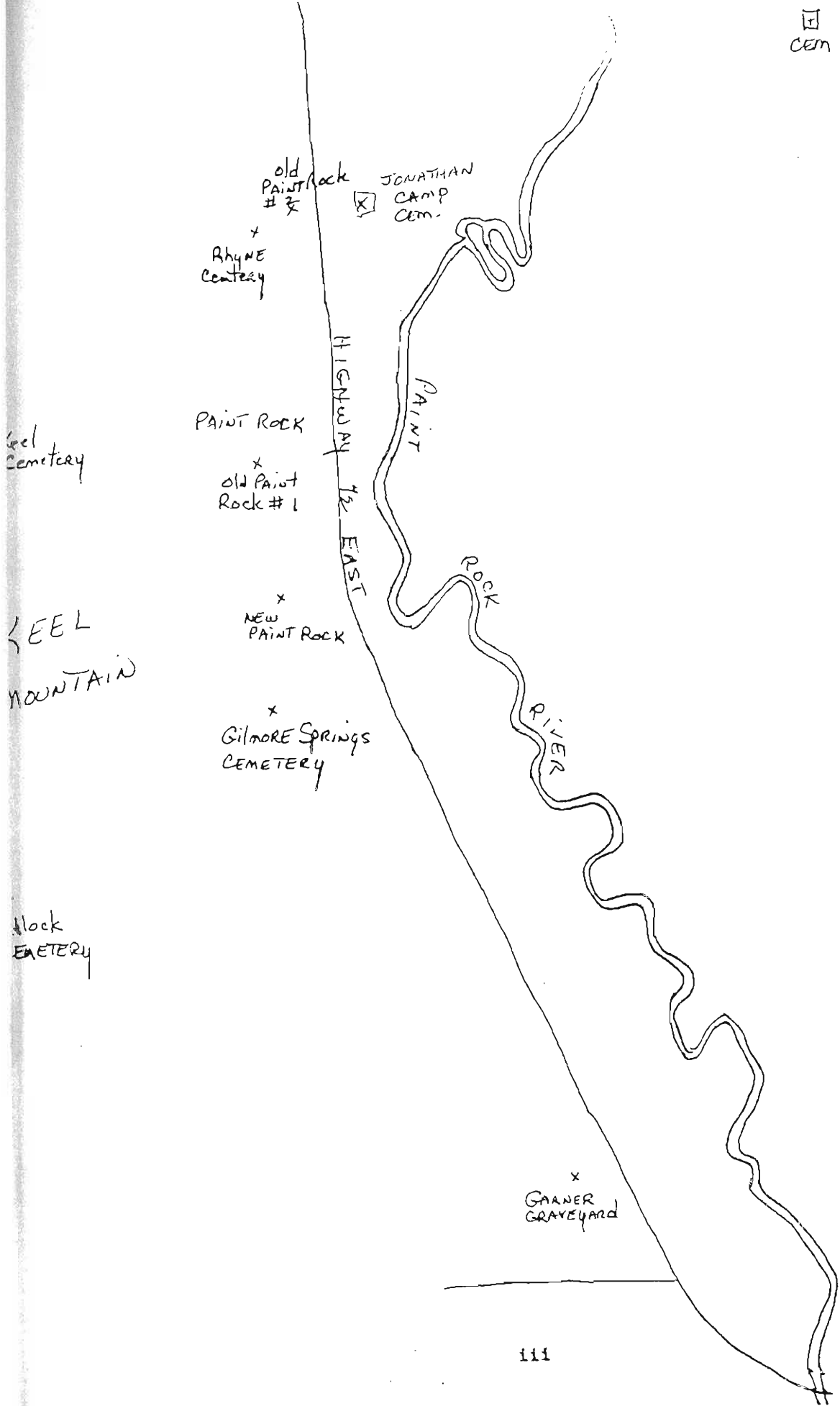

We feel sure that Martha Jones is buried either in Hale's Cove or in the Silas Jones Cemetery.

We have been told by Floyd Gwathney that his mother, Joan Woods Gwathney, and her infant child, were buried in this cemetery about 1919.

LATHAM CEMETERY (GUERIN)

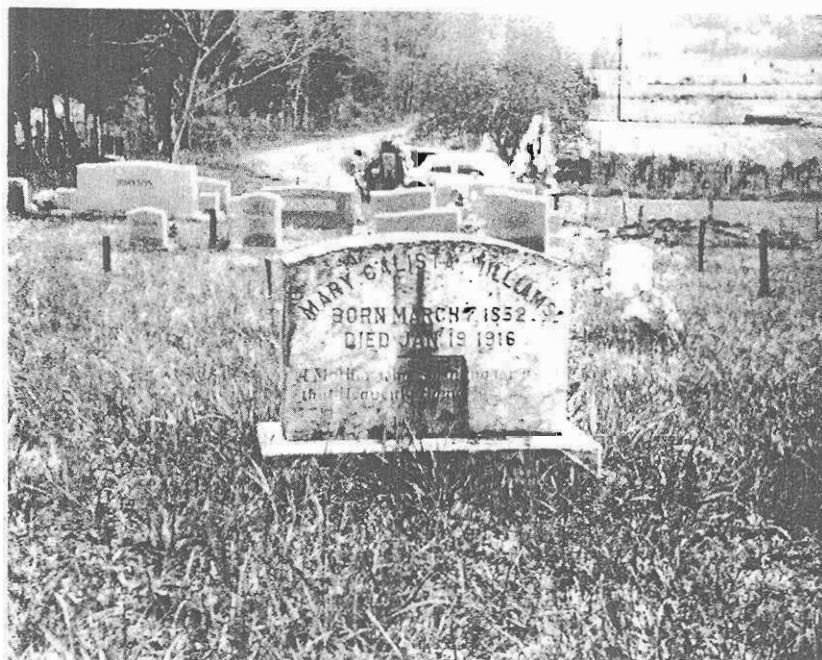

This cemetery is located in Township 3 South, Range 3 East, Section 9, approximately 3 to 4 miles north of Garth, off Clear Creek Road. We did not attempt to go to this cemetery since we had been told by Floyd Clemons that there were no marked tombstones. Toney Sinks is not shown on TVA maps but Mr. Clemons states that it is about 1/2 mile north of Keel Sinks. He estimated that there were about 20 unmarked graves here.

AN UNNAMED CEMETERY (PROBABLY JONES)

This unnamed cemetery, located about ½ mile north of Clear Creek Road, in Township 3 South, Range 3 East, Section 21, on a hillside just above the home of Floyd Clemons, is probably that of the William F. Jones family.

William F. Jones and his son, Hardy Bradford Jones, bought adjoining tracts of land in 1861 and probably owned the land where the cemetery is located. Jones' descendants from Texas and Oklahoma have visited here searching for graves of their great grandparents. There are 15 to 20 graves here, marked only by fieldstones, no inscriptions.

This unnamed cemetery is located Township 3 South, Range 3 East, Section 21, about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile northeast of Jones Cemetery described on preceding page, and about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile northeast of Floyd Clemons' home on Clear Creek Road.

William Lee was original purchaser of this land 28 September, 1830. There are at least 40 unmarked graves here. The only inscription is hand-lettered:

Obituary from Progressive Age, Scottsboro, Alabama, February 13, 1890:

"Mr. Hilliau Rousseau died on Monday the 9th inst. at the residence of his son, D. T. Rousseau, at the ripe old age of 88 years. Mr. Rousseau was born in Wilkes County, N. C. June 2, 1802. He removed to Fayetteville, Tenn., in 1825, and six years later he moved to this county, where he lived a quiet, useful life for sixty-five years. During the last eight years of his life he was a consistent member of the Christian church. The remains were interred in the family burying ground on the premises of Mr. D. T. Rousseau, near Garth, on Tuesday of this week. One by one the landmarks are removed."

David Thomas Rousseau was married to Belzora Thompson in Bibb County, Alabama 13 February, 1851. One child, Mary Drucilla, survived this marriage. She married Frederick John Robinson in Jackson County, Alabama 24 October, 1872. Mary and John are buried in the Latham (Guerin) Cemetery on Clear Creek.

David Thomas Rousseau's second wife was Martha A. St. Clair, daughter of Richard and Sarah St. Clair. They were married in Jackson County, Alabama 23 December, 1855, by Claiborne B. Hill, Justice of the Peace.

The three young sons of David Thomas and Martha Rousseau died within a seven weeks period with typhoid fever. We do not know if John's young wife, Susan A. (Tipton) Rousseau, also died at this time.

"Commissioner D. T. Rousseau has been confined to his bed at the residence of Sam J. Hamlet the past two days with a severe cold grippe."

Progressive Age, Friday, December 25, 1891:

"Died in Scottsboro on the 22nd inst Commissioner D. T. Rousseau of Garth, deceased at the residence of Mr. Sam J. Hamlett, where he was stopping during the term of Commissioners' Court. Mr. Rousseau left home on Sunday, the 13th inst, to attend a term of the Commissioners' Court of which he was a member, during the following week. On Wednesday morning he was quite ill and was compelled to take to his bed. His illness continued with but little change until a short time before death came. In the meantime his son was summoned from home to attend his father. However, but little importance was attached to the condition of Mr. Rousseau until the night of the 21st inst when a messenger was sent to summon the other members of the family to the dying man's bedside. He died before his wife and other relatives reached him. The remains were carried to Paint Rock and from there conveyed to the home of the deceased where the burial took place in the family burying ground. In the death of Mr. Rousseau the community and county lose a most excellent citizen."

SIMEON and MOLLIE KIRKPATRICK HOUK

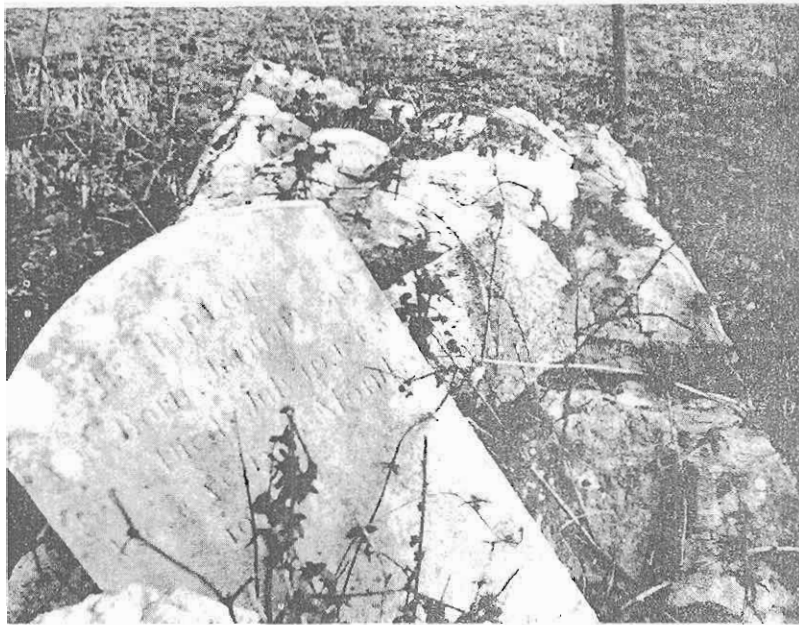

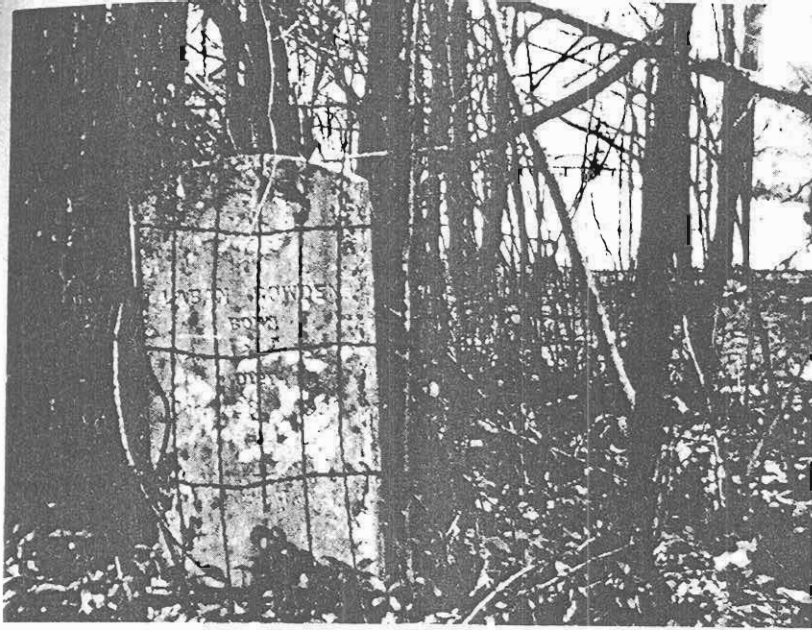

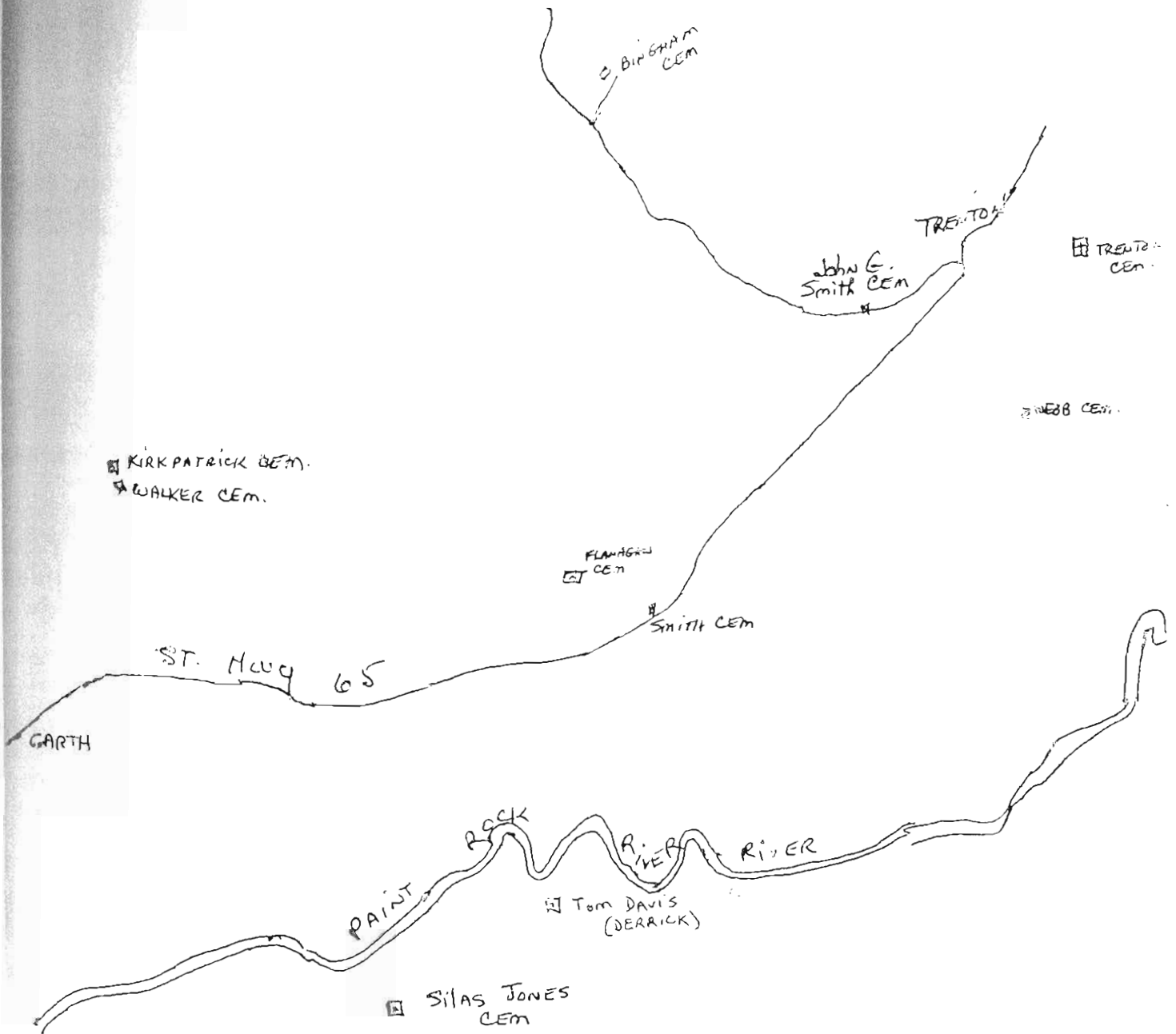

BINGHAM CEMETERY

This cemetery is located in Township 3 South, Range 3 East, Section 25 in Bingham Cove, at the foot of Bingham Mountain, on a logging road about 1/8 mile north of the Lewis Bingham place and about 1 mile northwest of Trenton. There is a good fence around these graves - approximately 12 to 14 graves with no tombstones. A tree is down across the fence. Lizzie Bingham Austin states that her grandmother, Mary Bingham, wife of Lewis Bingham, is buried here. We feel sure that Lewis Bingham is buried here also since this cemetery was on his land and near his homesite.

Minutes of the Tennessee River Association of Missionary Baptists, October, 1892, state that Trenton Church lost five members by death since the last association (Trenton church did not send a delegate to the association in 1891). Included were Thomas Bingham and Rebecca Bingham. The minutes also state that Thomas Bingham was one hundred and one years and six days old when he died.

MOON (BINGHAM) CEMETERY on BINGHAM MOUNTAIN

This cemetery is located in Township 3 South, Range 3 East, Section 23 NW $\frac{1}{4}$ on Bingham Mountain. Although commonly called Bingham Cemetery, it is shown on TVA topo maps as Moon Cemetery. One Moon descendant related that the cemetery was located on two sides of a school - with Bingham's burying on one side and Moons on the other. There are 40 to 50 graves with sandstone rock markers only - no inscriptions.

WEBB CEMETERY (OLD BOTTOM)

This cemetery is located in Township 3 South, Range 4 East, Section 31, Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south of Trenton. The land where the cemetery is situated was entered by John J. Campbell 3 August, 1830.

There are many, many graves here marked only with native fieldstones and the cemetery is completely overgrown with vines and other growth. Many of the graves are sunken, then covered over with vines, making it difficult to walk without stepping in a hole. There may be other tombstones here that we could not locate. This seems to have served as the community cemetery until about 1917 - 1919 when the first deaths are recorded in the "new" Trenton cemetery about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north of this site. TVA topo maps show this as the "Webb Cemetery".

TRENTON CEMETERY

Trenton Cemetery is located in Township 3 South, Range 4 East, Section 30, about 1 mile east of State Highway 65. Tabitha Wilborn and her husband, Gideon Wilborn, came into the Paint Rock Valley area from Barren County, Kentucky in the early 1800's. Tabitha bought the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 30 (where this cemetery is located) when it was first offered at Public Sale 5 July, 1830. One of her sons, Elias Wilborn, settled near Langston, Alabama but most Paint Rock Valley Wilbourns descend from her son, Aquilla Wilbourn and his wife, Elizabeth Wilson, who purchased land near Tabitha's in 1832.

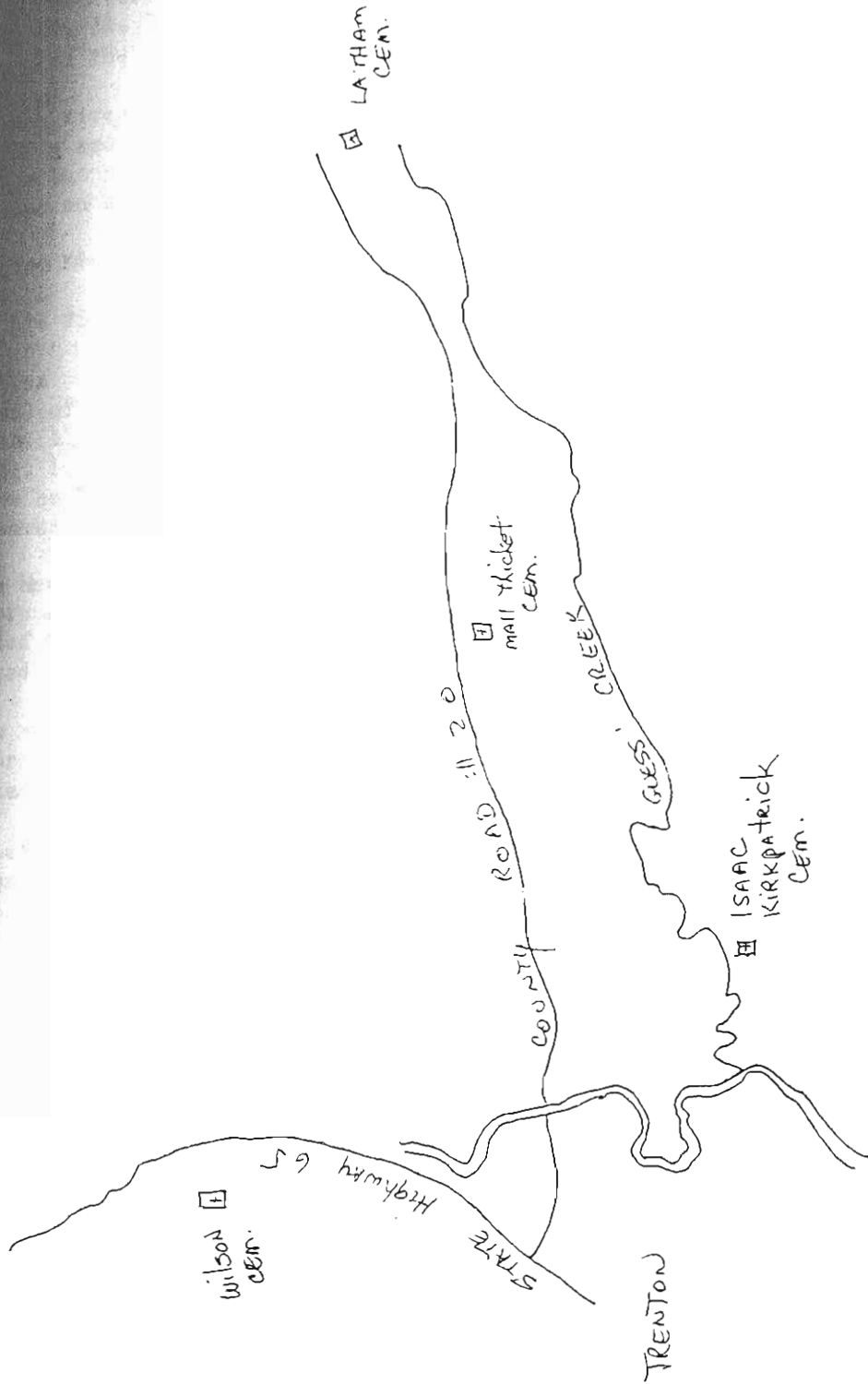

OLD KIRKPATRICK (ISAAC) CEMETERY

We have not been to this cemetery but have been told that the area has been farmed over, none of the tombstones are extant, and all traces of the cemetery have vanished.

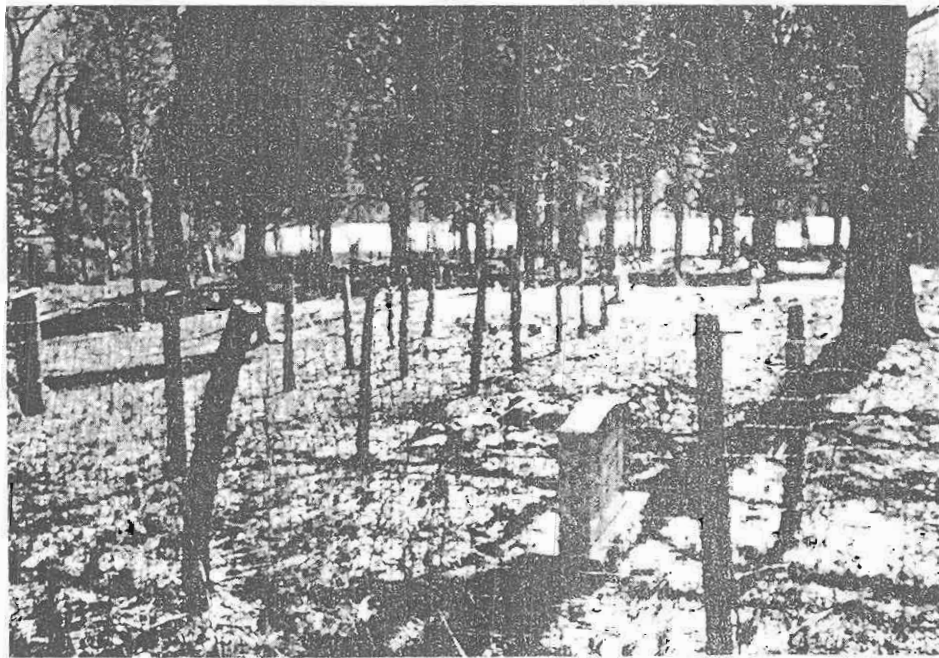

Rebecca (Davis) Freeman was an original owner of surrounding land and the handmade marker, according to a member of the Davis family, is that of hers. Family Bible records of Sam Davis, Sr. give the year of her birth as 1827. Date of death is unknown.

It is believed by descendants that Samuel B. Davis, Sr. and his wife, Nancy, are buried here in unmarked graves. This seems logical since the cemetery is on their land and at least four of their children are buried here with tombstones

TALIAFERRO CEMETERY

Taliaferro Cemetery is in Princeton on County Road #3, just off Highway 65. It is in the southwest quarter of Section 19, Township 2 South, Range 4 East, adjacent to the Clay Family Cemetery and across the road from the Clay Community Cemetery. Many graves in this cemetery are those of the family of Elder Richard Henry Taliaferro who was a prominent circuit rider and missionary in North Alabama and Tennessee. He is said to have established most of the Baptist churches in Paint Rock Valley - Mt. Nebo at Hollytree, Freedom Baptist at Estill Fork and possibly the Baptist church at Francisco. Elder Taliaferro and his wife, Elizabeth Ballard, settled in Paint Rock Valley and lived here for about twelve years before his death in 1869.

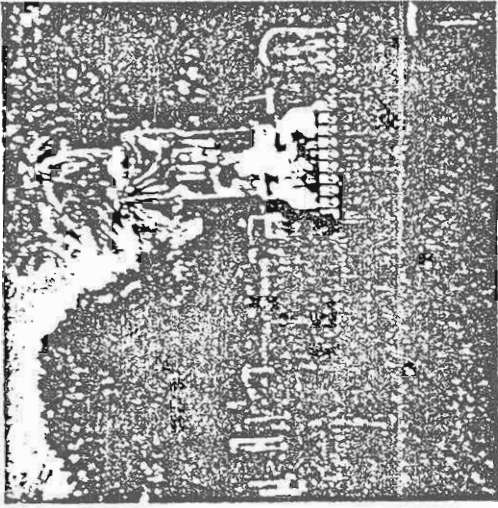

Lawson of the Chicamauga Iron Works has just completed a beautiful and substantial iron fence around the Clay Family burying ground and a beautiful monument purchased by M. A. Clay and his four sisters, in memory of their father and mother. The monument is fine work, carved in snow white marble. The monument stands at the head of the two graves in the center of a half acre lot. On the north side of the shaft is inscribed "Let me go, take me now" - the last words of Mahaley Clay who was born Feb. 2, 1817 and died June 10, 1892. "Rest, mother, rest in quiet sleep".

On the side of the monument is a hand holding an open Bible, below which is the following inscription: "Erected by M. A. Clay and his four sisters in loving remembrance of father and mother." 1892"
