














































A History of First Southern National Bank *Yesterday and Today*

Allison, William W. Bogart, R.L. Bowles, Jack Caperton, Carolyn Hall, Jack Livingston, Walker McCutchen, Conley Smith, John E. Rudder, Bunn W. Lovelady, Pickens Russell, R.R. Sanders, Sanders Russell, Billy H. Vinson, Jo John Williams, and Michael Ellenburg.
















