THE DIARY OF REV. THOMAS BENTON PARKS

The original of this Diary is in the possession of Mr. Julian T. Clemens, Scottsboro, Alabama, a grandson of Thomas B. Parks. Mr. Clemens says that his grandfather kept a more detailed diary, preceding this one, over a long period of time. The whereabouts of this other diary is not known, nor even if it is extant.

Thomas B. Parks was born March 27, 1832, and died May 24, 1918, living all his life in Jackson County, Alabama. He was the son of John and Ruth (Brown) Parks, early settlers of this region. He was a farmer, Methodist minister, and a Postmaster at Collum, Alabama.

His first wife was Martha Ann Hudgins, daughter of Benjamin Hudgins. To this union were born two sons: Anson Benjamin ("Ben Yancy") and Jerome Black Parks. Martha Ann Parks is buried in the Hudgins Cemetery, near Scottsboro, Alabama.

After the death of his first wife, he married Mary Jane Pierce, daughter of Solomon B. and Virginia Pierce. To this union were born the following children: Solomon Pierce; Deborah; John Cleberne; Eva Dillatoure; Samuel Robert; Adar Brown; Mary Elizabeth; Joseph Frederic; Lovick Benton.

Mary Jane Parks, consort of Thomas B. Parks, died October 26, 1877. She is buried in the old Pierce Cemetery, located on the farm owned by her father, near old Section Ferry on the Tennessee River, Scottsboro, Alabama.

Thomas B. Parks's third wife was Mrs. Elizabeth (Brown) Hornbuckle. No children were born to this union. Persons still living who knew this wife, Elizabeth, say she was kind and loving to his children, and he, in turn, was kind and loving to her daughter, Miss Eva Hornbuckle.

Rev. Thomas B. Parks and his wife, Elizabeth, are buried in the Burgess Cemetery, old Campground Vicinity, near Scottsboro, Alabama. Elizabeth Parks was born July 30, 1841, and died January 31, 1915. (Cemetery Record)

James Monroe Parks was born July 9, 1819. And was married to Cenia (?) Justice while he was quite young -- Some years after this marriage there was born to them John Thomas Parks, March 2d. 1849, his mother dieing a few days after his birth, he was taken to the home of his grandmother with whom he remained untill the death of his grandmother in 1855 -- then he lived with his uncle J. G. Parks -- untill his father emigrated to Texas in 1870 and in 1870 Aug. 30 he died in Leon county Texas.

This John Thomas Parks was only child by this first marriage.

Diary--1887-8-9

Attended burial service of Sarah Jenkins wife of King Jenkins -- & mother of Jefferson J. & John Jenkins, at 12 oclock A.M. Wednesday Aug 31st. 1887.

Celebrated the rites of matrimony Between Joseph L. Burgess and Addie L. Jenkins at 4 oclock P.M. Wednesday Aug. 31st. 1887.

(<u>Note</u>: Above Sarah Jenkins was the grandmother of the Addie L. Jenkins who married the day her grandmother was buried; Addie was a daughter of John King and Lucinca J. (Kirby) Jenkins. I.J.M.)

Conducted burial service of Bell -- Daughter of S. H. & Mary M. Green Sunday 15th January 1888.

Attended Burial Service of Mollie, daughter of Elizabeth and W. P. Young. Jan. 1st 1888.

Buried Mrs. Elizabeth widow of W. Preston Young on Feb. 5th 1888--

Attended the burial of Mrs. Willbanks wife of David Willbanks 2d Sunday in March 1888--

Attend the burial of Ala Kirby daughter of Dr. A. J. Kirby on May 20th 1888--

Attended the burial service of Bessie, daughter of Willis and Ruth Idear Sisk on Sunday March 9th 1890--

Attend the Service and burial of Stellar daughter of Willis and Ruth Idear Sisk March 19th 1890 -- This child would have been 6 years old had she lived untill October following and gave the most supporting testimony of her love and knowledge of the Savior and Heaven and immortality of any person of her age that was my pleasure to know within the observation of 40 years of my religious life. Surely with tongues of babes has he taught us.

Attended the Burial Service of Joseph N. Finey -- and Mr. Westmoreland at the Finey Graveyard on 2d. of April 1890. This was in some respects the most remarkable burial I ever witnessed, the burial of J. W. Finey was first performed by the Farmers Alliance ritual with quite a large number of the members participating; in the presence of the largest audience I ever witnessed in the Tennessee River Valley -- after the imposeing seremonies of the Alliance had been concluded T. B. Parks according to request of Bro. Finey began the Solemn Service of the ritual of the M. E. Church South for the dead -- being aided by the Rev. E. J. Stockton -- after which the body was placed in the valt and by kind and faithful neighbors and friends the grave was filled, and loving hands strewed flowers on the red mound of the last resting place of a faithful Steward and church member -- a good citizen and Neighbor affectionate husband and kind father of four children.

After which the Farmers Alliance -- proceeded to bury Mr. Westmoreland with the usual ceremonies and honors of the Alliance to which were added the Service of Song and prayer by T. B. Parks as per request of the Family.

Sept 17th-- Married Jas W Cosby to Mary E. Jenkins at Wash Jenkins Attended the Burial Services Sept 8th of Mary infant daughter of Wm and Josiephine Tiffin.

Diary for 1891

April 5th 1891-- Celebrated the rites of matrimony between James B. Morgan and Miss Matilda Hollis. Daughter of Rufus and Ann Hollis at the residence of E. B. Ligon. Also between Thos B. Pendergrass and Miss Kate Young-- at the residence of John Young her Brother.

Apr 8 Wednesday -- returned home From the county Alliance at 12 o'clock A.M. Solemnized the rites of Matrimony between James R. Gayle and Miss Mahala Angeline Merdah at 4 o'clock P.M.

May 31st Celebrated the rites of Matrimony between John H. Tipton and Miss Hannah Collins in the Randall's Chapell church at 4 o'clock P.M. A full house witness the cerimonies.

J. H. Tipton is a son of B. W. Tipton-- and the last member of his family to marry-- and is the fifth one of said family for whom I have performed the marriage ceremony-- Miss Hannah was the daughter of Wood Collins who was a relative of Archie Collins, a noted settler in Paint Rock Valley in the early settling of Jackson Co. Her mother was a daughter of Robert Bynum, who settled in early life in what is now the corporate limits of Scottsboro-- where he raised a numerous family, consisting of two sons John P. and R. H. Bynum and Several daughters.

June 1891

June 14th, 1891 Solemnized the rites of Matrimony Between John R. Mefford and Miss Ienellen Hughes at 10 o'clock A.M. and attended the burial Services of Mrs. Katie Young wife of Allen Young and Sister of R. B.; S. H.; Rufus; and Joseph Green and daughter of Asa R. Green. This good woman (Katie Green) was most Brutally murdered by her husband on the morning of Saturday June 13th 1891. On examination of her person, it was found that she had received two blows on the head, one in the forehead directly over the left eye, one on the back and left side of the head— one stab directly under the left nipple from 4 to six inches in depth. Also one other stab immediately above the left nipple about the same depth, both passing entirely through the heart.

May 1st 1904

Solemnized the rites of Matrimony between William Miller and Miss Cora Smith at my residence on Sunday May the 1st 1904.

1905

Solemnized rites of matrimony Between Mr. Charles Miller and Miss Zoe Killian at my residence at Collum Ala on Sunday March 5, 1905.

Collum Ala Nov 7th 1903

Attended the buryal service of Mrs Emaline Sartin at the Finney grave yard on Nov 7th, 1903-- the following manuscript was read. Emaline Sartin was born June 2d, 1855. Departed this life Nov 6th 1903-- She had been a member of the Christian church for 25 years. Although she died very suddenly and not being conscious of the change, yet she had told her sister a short time before her death that she was prepared to die, and believed that she would go to heaven if called to die, often she said she was ready to go; and all that troubled her was leaving her children. The above named Emaline Sartin was the widow of Alexander Finney--being the daughter of Vardy Clark whose family was reared in the Goose Pond neighborhood. She leaves her children with Mrs Bell and Mrs Edmond C Smith, her sisters now residing in the immediate community where she was buried.

Aug 27 1899. Attended the burial service of Mrs Leaneah Ashmore, wife of Robert Ashmore- at the Goose Pond Cemetery--

Sept 17, 1902

Celebrated the rites of matrimony between J. W. Finney and Miss Angeline E. Walker at the residence of the Bride on the 17th Sept 1902--

Celebrated the rites of matrimony Between Worth Green and Martelia Tiffin, on Sept 17, 1902. The above named Worth Green being a son of R. B. Green who was the Son of Asa R. Green who was one of the early settlers of Jackson County, Ala-- and reared a large family-- to wit, James Green, R. B.; Rufus; Sam Huston; John; & Joseph. Daughters: Temperance, wife of B. W. Tipton; Mary, wife of John A. Swafford. Katie, wife of Allen Young, who in a state of insanity Stabed her to death in the cotton field on the old S. B. Pierce estate in year 1893, June 13th. And also Annetta- wife first of Richard Jenkins who died and left her in early life with one child, named George. She afterwards became the wife of Capt J. H. Dicus high Sherriff of the county.

Nov 20th 1902

his home is in the state of Tenn.

Solemnized the rites of Mattrimony Between C. W. Argo and Mrs. E. D. Reed at her residence-- Mr Argo being 67 years of age and Mrs Reed 73 years of age. These parties had been fighting the battles of life each living alone for many years-- We pray that this union may prove a mutual blessing to them in the eavening of human life.

Dec 29 1902 Solemnized the rites of matrimony Between Charley Kirby and Miss Onie Oakley at my residence Collum Ala at 9:30 o'clock P.M. 1902. The weather was very cold the parties suffered considerable in making the trip from Mrs. Wallace's to my house and back-The above named Charley Kirby is Son of Thomas P. Kirby and a grand son of Mrs E. D. Argo who was formerly Mrs. E. D. Reed, mother of Lenos, wife of T. P. Kirby and the mother of Charley above named; Miss Onie Oakley is reputed to be the daughter of Mr. Tate, who has considerable wealth--

Collum Ala Dec 31 1902

Dec 31 Solemnized the rites of matrimony Between W. L. Coulson and Ruth Childress at the residence of Mrs Mattie Childress at 2 o'clock P.M. Dec 31st 1902. William L. Coulson is a grandson of Jonath Milton, Deceased and Jemima Burgess. Miss Ruth Childress is a grand daughter of John K. Childress, deceased, and daughter of Silas P. Childress deceased who was a son of John K. Childress. Jan 4th 1903. Attend the funeral Services of H. C. Childress at the Residence of G. F. Smithon Sunday Jan 1903 at 20 clock P.M.

Died on March 25 A. D. 1903 - Buried in Wood's Cove Cemetery March 26th 1903-by Rev S. J. Parrish, C. L. Aldridge & Rve Mr Sloan of the Baptist church. Brother Wood professed religion and joined church when quite a boy. Was licensed to Exhort when he was a young man -- after exorcising as an Exhorter for several years he was licensed to preach -- which he did for many years --He took great delight in the services of the House of God and was faithful in his duty to God -- and was ever anxious for the prosperity of the church -and the Salvation of Sinners -- he bore a constant and burning zeal for poor lost men and women. A model man and citizen and christian, a Kind Father and husband, a good neighbour generous to a fault. He had fully learned and accepted God's word-- that God loves a cheerful Giver. His liberality was larger than his means--having been a Steward in the church for many years, he always bore the Kindest Sympathy for those who filled this responsible position in his church, showing a ready and willing mind to support the institution of the church-- being a loyal methodis in doctrine and practice --

Feby 24, 1906

Jemima Burgess--who was formerly Jemima Thomas-- was born March 29, 1822, was married to Jonathan M. Burgess Dec. 13th 1840. Departed this life February 24, 1906, aged 83 years 10 months and 25 days, having lived all these years at the residence where she died. The writer of this short sketch was born March the 27, 1832 and has known Jemima Burgess from his earliest recoolection and has been a near neighbor and intimate friend all his life, the most cordial and warm friendship existing between us with out a break through out all these years. Her love and kind friendship has been a great benediction to my life.

Oct. 29, 1906

Julia Ann Russell Daughter of James and Reccah Russell of this vicinity. Died Oct 29, 1906-- She borned and reared in this vicinity. I do not know the date of her birth, but suppose from reccollection having known her all of her life, She must have lived near 70 years. She was borned in destitution, lived and died poor, hers was a life of deprivation.

Died Wednesday Oct. 31 1906 Capt. W. H. Dicus, near Randall's Chapell in the vicinity of Scottsboro where he was borned and reared. Capt. Dicus was a Captin in the Confederat Army, and was a brave and daring soldier. After the war he was Sheriff of Jackson for four years-- after which he persued farming, untill age and feebleness disabled him. He lived to be about 80 years of age.

Miss Mittie McKay's mother was Iley(?) Burgess a daughter of Richard Burgess who came to Ala with the first settlers of Jackson county, and was the elder brother of Starling -- Jas M. and William Burgess, also of three sisters, Issable Green, wife of Asa R. Green, Temperance Russell, wife of John W. Russell, Ruth B. wife of John K. Childress, who is the father of Hugh G.
