

Mar 1, 1906 PA: Carns Column. "Miss Lillian Mussetteers's school is progressing nicely. Our box supper here was a success. There was \$31 realized. The proceeds will go to heat seat the new school house."

May 19, 1906 PA: Carns Column. "The school at this place will given an entertainment Saturday night, May 19th. Children under six years will be admitted free. Children six to twelves, ten center. Above twelves years, fifteen cents."

Nov 18, 1909 PA: Politicians lectured at all existing schools in 1909 for passage of Alabama Constitutional Amendment 1909 that prohibited the "manufacture, sale and keeping for sale of alcoholic and malt liquors and other intoxicating beverages." It was defeated 61% No, 39% Yes. Rev. Marion Briscoe spoke for the amendment at Carnes School Nov 23, 1909.
