

NOTICE OF SPECIAL THREE-MILL ELECTION

Center Point District No. 54. Notice is hereby given that a Specin Election will be held in Center Point School District No. 54, Jackson occurty, Alabama, at the residence of Mrs. Robertson, in said district, on the 10th day of February, 1522, for the purpose of determining whether or not a special tax shall be levied and collected annually, at the rate of thirty cents on each one hundred dellars' worth of taxable propcity in Center Point District No. 51, said county, and to be continued for a period of 8 years from September 20th, 1922, the same to be for the support of the public school within stid district.
