This school in the Hambrick Precinct was named Price's Chapel on Bingham Mountain. By 1938, Hambrick School was located on Putman Mountain west of Princeton.

Aug 2, 1951 PA: "Sale of School Property. Notice is hereby given that the Jackson County Board of Education will accept sealed bid until 12 o'clock noon August 31, 1951 on the school property listed below....Hambrick School Building and 2 acres of land...Signed Delbert Hicks, Superintendent of Education."

Hambrick District No. 71,
at **School House**
Jackson County, Alabama, on the 26th day of July 1928, for the purpose of determining whether or not a special tax shall be levied and collected annually, at the rate of 30 cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property in
Hambrick District No. 71,
in said county, and to be continued for a period of two years from September 30, 1928, the same to be for the support of the public schools within said district. The boundaries of said district are as follows:
Beginning at SE corner of section 34, Tp 1, R 3; thence east 1 mile; thence north to Madison county line; thence with said Madison county line to SW corner of section 21, Tp 2, R 3; thence east 2 miles; thence north 4 miles to point of beginning. Said district contains sections 27, 24, 35, and that part of sections 21, 22, 23, 26, 28, and 33, Tp 1, R 3, lying in Jackson county; also sections 3, 8, 9, 10, 15, 16, 17, 21, 22, that part of sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 18, 19, 20, Tp 2, R 3, lying in Jackson county. All of said district being in Jackson county, Ala.

Genia Johnson Baugh, In the "100 Schools of Jackson Co." by Wendell Page, He states that #71 is Price's Chapel, located on Bingham Mt. & the 1907 Precinct map shows it there in S15/T3/R3. #45 is Nila Sch. at Crow Mt. He states that it was closed in 1939, but Mable says she entered 1st grade there in 1951 & left in 1954 when her parents moved to Skyline, but Nila was still open. #73 is Mt. Sane at Beachboro, Al. P. O.. Open 1908-1923 in S22/T2/R4. But the 1907 Precinct map shows Mt. Sane in S36/T1/R4. I would like to find more info on Beachboro, Al., it is shown near where I now live on one map.
