


The Larkinsville school is potentially the oldest school in the county. There are front page stories about this school in papers from the 1860s.

Aug 8, 1889 PA: "In Larkinsville township Wiley Frazier, John West and Aaron Woosley were elected" trustees.

Mar 31, 1893 PA: Larkinsville News. Prof. D. I. Durham's school will close this week.

May 16, 1895 SC: "The steady workmen keep adding a plank to our schoolhouse. The design of the belfry or cupola is elegant."

Aug 15, 1885 SC: "The ice cream supper Saturday night, in behalf of the new school building, was a success. The new school is being painted by J. E. Mason. It brings out in it a commanding appearance and stands as a credit to its founders."

Apr 2, 1908 SC: "Miss Annie Boyd has finished teaching the public school at Larkinsville, and returned home."

Jul 8, 1915 PA: "The School Improvement Association of the Larkinsville School will give an ice cream supper on Saturday night, July 10, for the benefit of the school house. Everybody is invited to come out and support the good cause."

Mar 9, 1922 PA: Larkinsville News. "Our school is already feeling the influence of the work done by the recently organized Parent-Teacher Association. Olive Petty is being kept from the school this week by a sprained ankle. Our school just received a three-page map. The School Improvement Association will give a pie supper, fish pond and old-fashioned spelling bee Saturday night March 11th. Everybody invited to come and help in a good cause and enjoy the fun.
