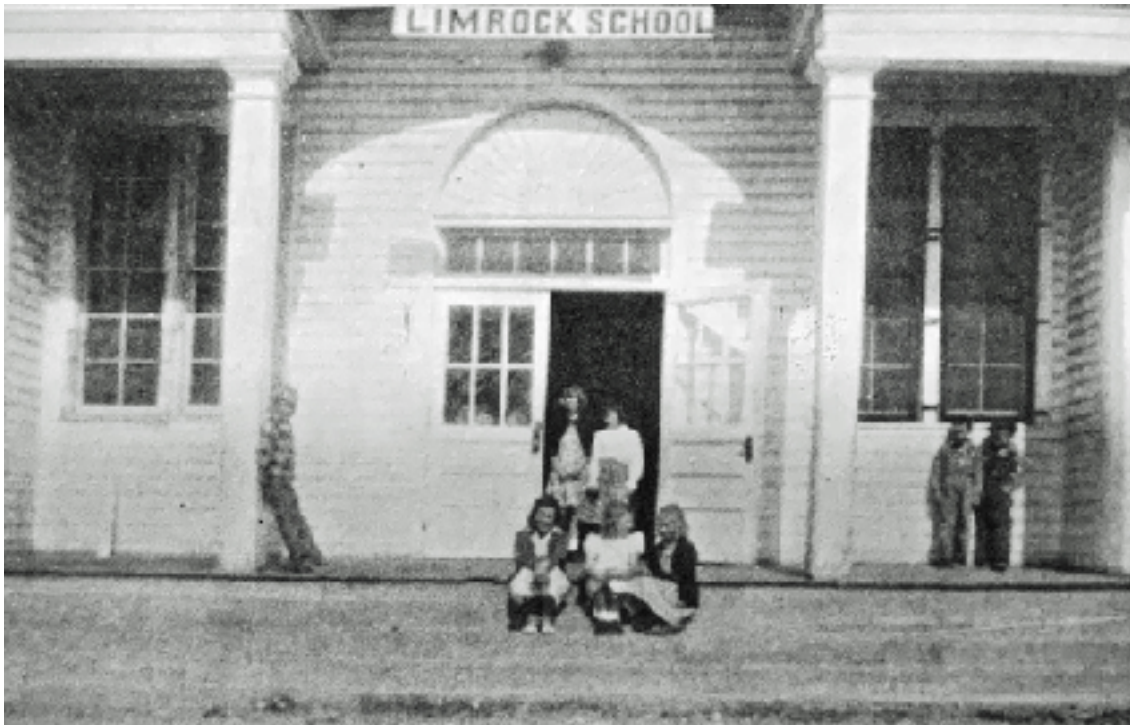

Aug 8, 1896 SC: "Prof. Wm. M. Gormley is teaching school at Limrock."

Jun 9 ,1898 "We have a good school. Everybody n interested. We are to have an entertainment soon."

Dec 6, 1900 SC: "Elmore Kenamer, who is now teaching school at Limrock, was in town last of the week."

Jul 9, 1908 SC: "There will be a picnic at the new school house, near Limrock, on Saturday, July 18th. Everybody invited to come and bring well filled baskets. The refreshments will be run for the benefit of the new school house. A fine time promised."

"Jul 18, 1912 PA: "Miss Madge Port is teaching a summer school near Limrock."

Dec 28, 1922 PA: "After two unsuccessful attempts to carry the Three Mil School Tax in the Limrock School District, it was carried by a majority of 36 to 32 Wednesday of this week. It was a hard fight to put this over, but it has been accomplished."

Feb 1, 1923 PA: Semi-Annual Statement of Receipts and Disbursements for the County Depository of Jackson County, Alabama, 1922-1923: Eugene Webster was paid \$3.80 for serving as enumerator for the school census for District 109.

 Limrock School District No. 81 in Jackson County, Ala., on Wednesday, the 37th day of December, 1922, to determine whether or not a special tax of thirty cents on each one hundred dollar worth of taxable property in said
 Limrock School District No. 81 in said county, shall be levied and collected annually for a period of 5 years from the 10th day of Sept. 1923, for the support of the public schools within said
 Limrock School District No. 81 in said County. The boundaries of said
 Limrock School District No. 81 are as follows:
 Beginning at the South West corner of Section 23, Township 4, N. 4; thence East 2 miles; thence North 1/2 mile; thence East 1 mile; thence North 2 1/2 miles; thence West 1 mile; thence North 1 mile; thence West 1/2 mile thence North 1 mile; thence West 2 miles; thence South 2 1/2 miles; thence East 1 mile; thence South 2 miles to point of beginning.
 Said district contains: Sec. 6; the W 1/2 of Sec. 10; the East 1/2 and E 1/4 of Section 8; Sections 15, 16, 17, 20, 21, 22, 23, 25, 26, 28, 29, 34; the N 1/2 of Sec. 35, all in Twp 4 Range 4, in Jackson county, Ala.
