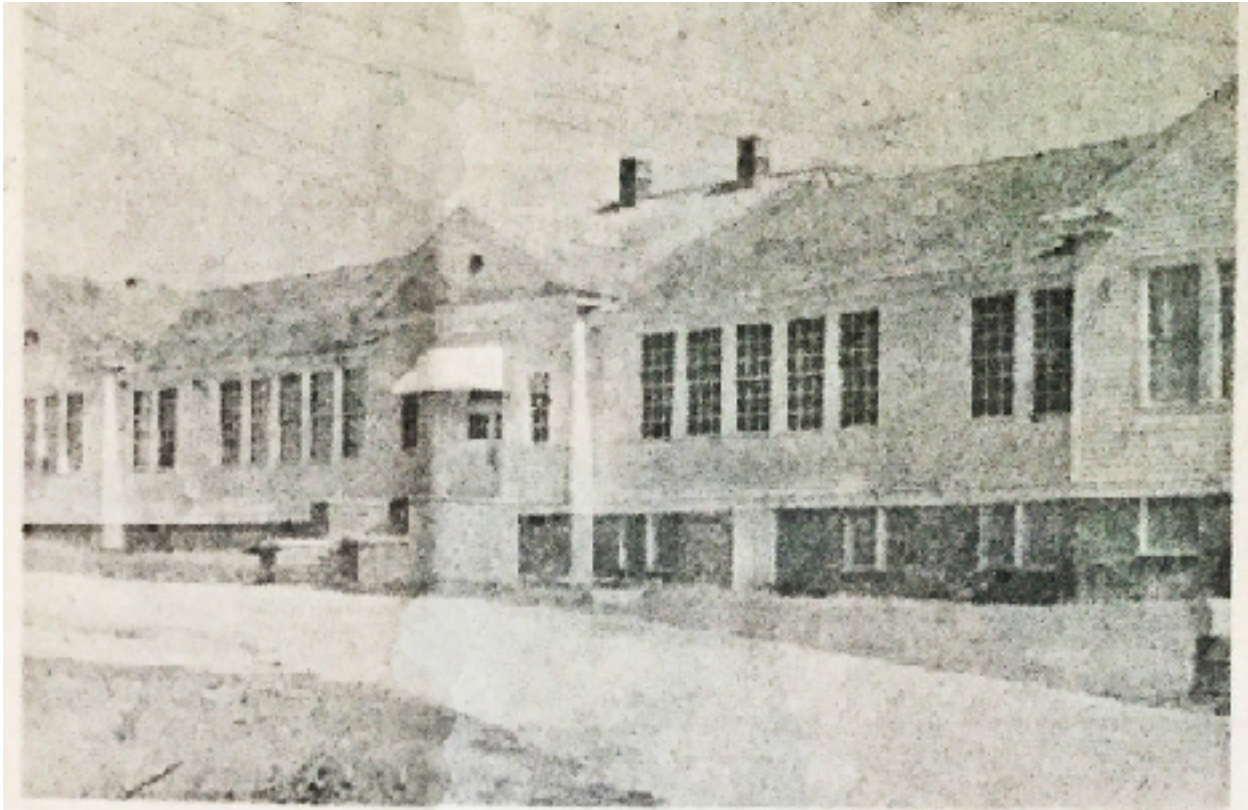

This is Macedonia School from a 1960 feature about the community.



The 22-year old school has become the focal point of the community. Each meeting of the Macedonia Rural Development Club is held at the School. During the meeting, there is supervised recreation for all age groups. Following the meeting, there is a recreational and social time for the adults. The school was repainted and the outdoor toilets removed during the last year by the Staff Club.

**Jul 21, 1898 PA:** Miss Laura Bell opened school at Macedonia last Monday.”

**Nov 18, 1909 PA:** Politicians lectured at all existing schools in 1909 for passage of Alabama Constitutional Amendment 1909 that prohibited the “manufacture, sale and keeping for sale of alcoholic and malt liquors and other intoxicating beverages.” It was defeated 61% No, 39% Yes. Rev. Marion Briscoe spoke for the amendment at Macedonia School Nov 17, 1909.
