
Rocky Ridge School

Location: Extended Woodville, Marshall

County

District: 63 (part of Woodville)
Teacher in 1923: Herman Campbell
Grades Covered: 1 through 6




This school was active as early as 1912 because Dr. Julian Hodges, born in 1904, attended school here. It is an unusual Jackson County school because it was actually in Marshall County just south of Woodville. This most likely was a church where school was also held since reference is also made to attending church at Rocky Ridge. J. R. R. Kennamer in his *Story of Woodville* notes that J. B. Woodall sold cedar rails on his farm in Thomas Cove, and the proceeds from cedar sold was used to build the Rocky Ridge school house. In 1923, this school was partly supported by Marshall County.

In 1912, Wiley Butler was the teacher, according to the class photo. Kennamer notes in his *Story of Woodville* that W. F. Burton taught at Rocky Ridge in 1913. Herman Campbell, shown at the right, taught here in 19243. In 1930, the Jackson County School Board appropriated \$44 a month to transport students from Rocky Ridge to Woodville School. This is probably transporting students who had aged out of the shared county school to the nearest local high school, Woodville. This school was never covered on county expenditures reports in the 1920s and is definitely not in the Jackson County School Educational Directory in 1938.

The earliest picture of this school is found in the Woodville Museum and shows the 32 students identified in the photograph below with Wiley Butler as their teacher. A 1922 photo of the school also in the museum shows 25 students, many of whom are pre-teen boys with fewer Grades 1-2 students and no teacher pictured or identified. A 1924 photo shows 32 students, mostly 1-6, with an unidentified teacher in the back.

Newspaper References:

Dec 2, 1915 SC: Woodville News. "There will be a box supper at Rocky Ridge Friday night. Every body invited."

Apr 20, 1917 PA: Rocky Ridge News is a standalone column. Two items about an egg hunt by the ladies of the R.R.L. society and a singing given by Vera Hodges.

Feb 2. 1922 PA: Paint Rock Bridge News. "Mr. and Mrs. J. P. Hodges attended school at Rocky Ridge last Sunday."

Jan 11, 1923 PA: Directory of Schools. Rocky Ridge is part of the Woodville District and Herman Campbell is the teacher.

Jan 29, 1925 PA: Rocky Ridge News. "School at this place is progressing nicely."

Feb 5, 1925 PA: Rocky Ridge News. "Several from here attended the play at Woodville Saturday night."

Jun 19, 1930 PA: Board of Education meeting of June 13. "A delegation came from the Board requesting transportation from Rocky Ridge school district in Marshal County to the Woodville School. The majority of the Board voted in favor of the proposition, E. H. Caldwell voted against it. However, a truck was employed to transfer the Marshall County pupils to Woodville at a cost of \$44.00 per month."

Jan 17, 1939 PA: "On Sunday afternoon January 30, the Rocky Ridge Singing Class will sing at Woodville High School Auditorium. Each and every one especially singer, are invited to attend."

Feb 17, 1938 PA: Singing Class at Rocky Ridge. "The Rocky Ridge singing class invited each and everyone interested in class singing to be present at the Woodville High School auditorium on Sunday afternoon, February 20, at 1:30 p.m. We have the promise of North quartets and extended this welcome invitation to all singers everywhere."

Apr 28, 1938 PA: Swearengin News. The North Quartett and Rocky Ridge Singing Choir performed at the May 8 Decoration Service.

May 12, 1960 PA: Julian Hodges biography. "The family lived near Woodville when Dr. Hodges was old enough to start school at Rocky Ridge Elementary School."
