

## Salem School

The first mention of this school is in the March 22, 1922 Progressive Age: "Salem School came over Friday to spell against Cross Roads. Cross Roads come out ahead." When the county board of education met in November 1972, this item is found: "The Superintendent was instructed to select three trustees from a list recommended by the patrons of the Salem School district. No members of the board knew any of the parties recommended."

In November 1937, the board of education report for the 1936-37 school year said that J. B. Johnson had been paid \$15 to cut wood for Salem School, and that Ernest Carter and J.B. Johnson had on three occasions been paid to make minor repairs at the school. Mr. Johnson also cut wood for the school the next year. The April 7, 1939 PA said that a clinic had been held to immunize residents for smallpox, diphtheria, and typhoid at Salem School, and again on May 15, 1941. Dogs were also vaccinated at the school in 1941 and 1942.
