

June 8, 1894 PA: Miss Hettie Knowlton is teaching school at this place.

**Jul 21, 1898 PA:** "Trenton. K. T. Jones is teaching the public school here. He recently closed a six months subscription school, which was well patronized."

**Jul 17, 1902 PA.** Trenton News. "We are just around of our fine school. It is second to none in the county but one of the best with seven new pupils added Monday."

**Oct 23, 1902 PA:** Hytop News. S. B. Wininger's school is out at Trenton and he is at home at this place."

**Nov 1, 1923 PA.** Trenton News. "School is progressing nicely although many are out helping to gather the crops...The school girls and boys have purchased a basketball."
