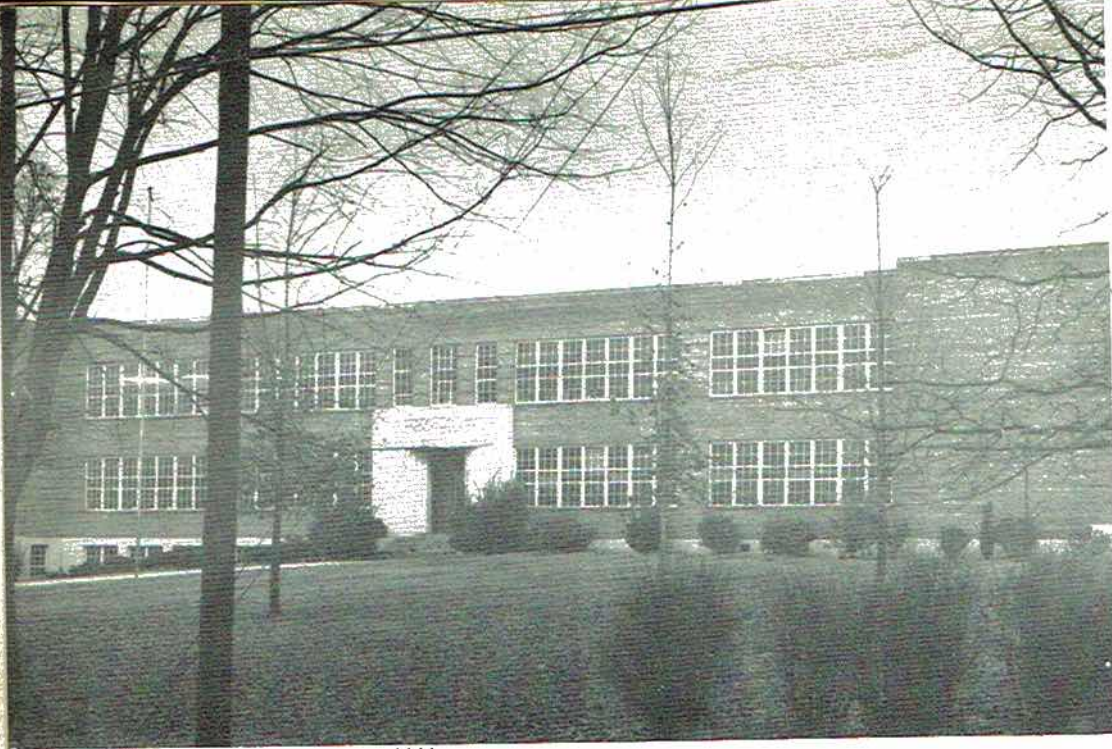




The purpose of this book is to present a tangible record of the lights and shadows of a school that we can never forget.

We have learned other fine things also. One of the big little things that we have learned, and been surprised at learning, is that the other student is a very fine chap once we get to know him. We have learned to respect each other and the rights of others; that the individual rights of one person are as important as the rights of another. Through it all, we have become a closely knit community of common interests with all working for the good of the whole group.

To this year's graduating class and to all of the others, I want to say that we wish for you the best of everything that can be of help to you, the finest that can be enjoyed properly, and just rewards for all of your sincere efforts. May God bless, guide, and keep all of you.
