## Our Prophecy

Scottsboro, Alabama January 11, 1970

Dear John,

It's wonderful being in Scottsboro again after so long. Yesterday was very eventful. Governor John "Shot Gun" Bentley was in town making a campaign speech for re-election. Rayford Thrasher and Edwin Thrasher are proprietors of Thrasher's Novelty Shop.


Catherine Gamble has become Alabama's first woman Senator.
