Dear John,

It's wonderful being in Scottsboro again after so long. Yesterday was very eventful. Governor John "Shot Gun" Bentley was in town making a campaign speech for re-election. The Jackson County High School Band, directed by Winston Payne, who is also teaching chemistry at our Alma Mater, led a colorful parade around the square.

Mayor William Hunt welcomed the governor, who was accompanied by his private secretary and campaign manager, Janette Porter.

The "Sentinel's" star reporter, Rena Matthews, covered the event.

Also home to be honored at the parade yesterday was Major-General Howard Phillips, hero of the Korean War and brilliant military strategist.
