

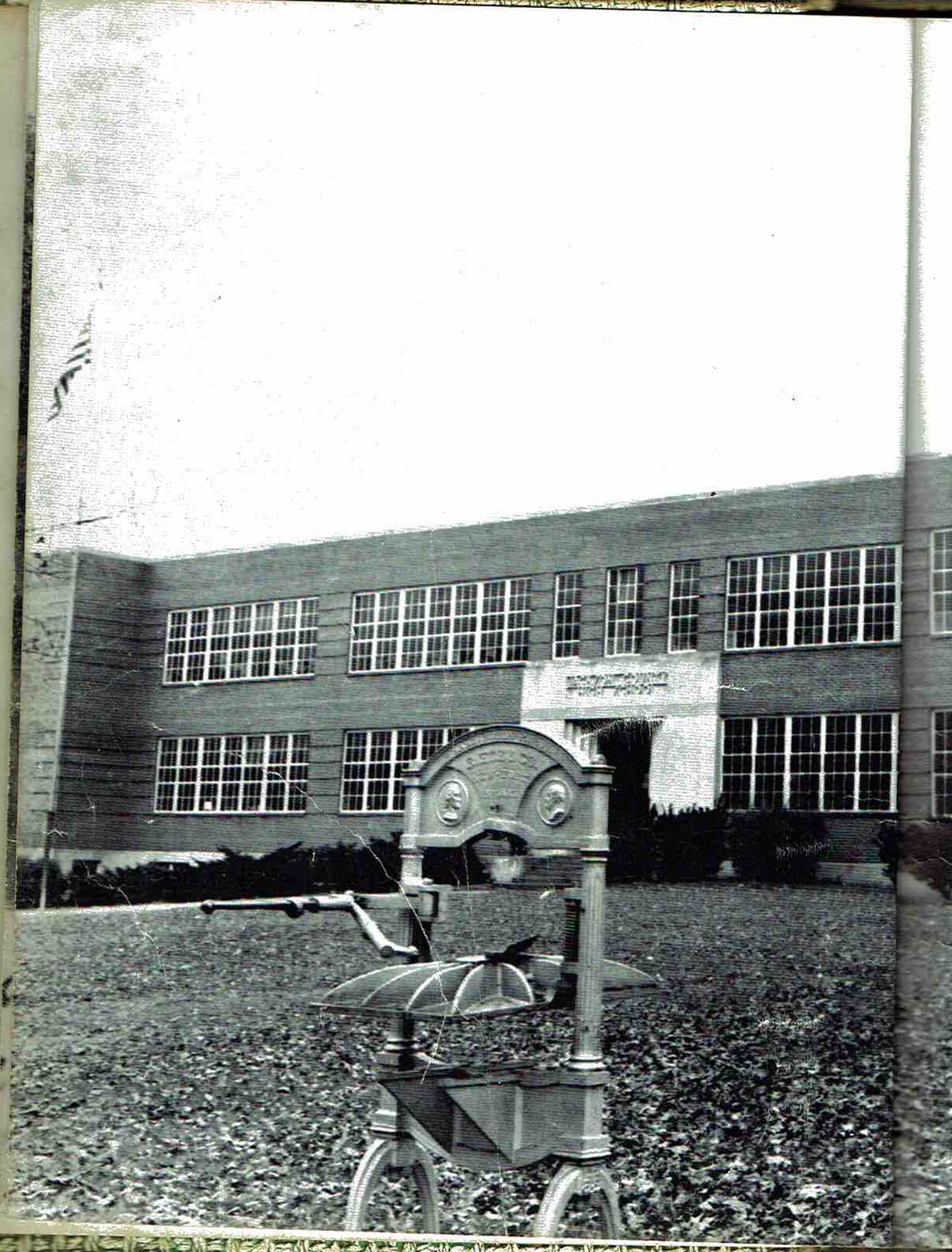

Until in heaven we'll meet.

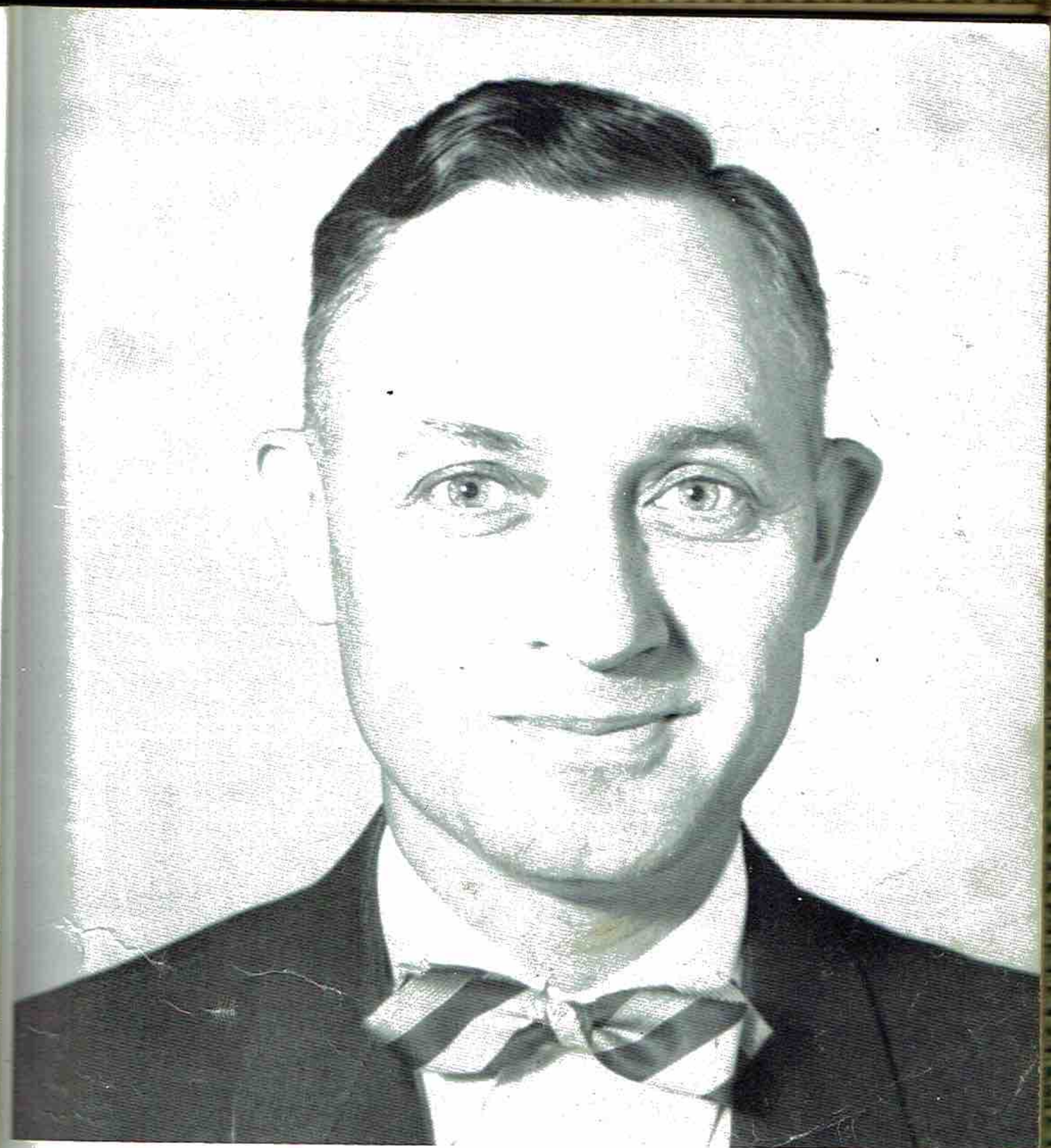

Wildcats Trample Section Cagers 91-70 A Brilliant Battle Here Tuesday Night

SCOTTSBORO IS TOP-SEEDED IN EIGHT DISTRICT Tournament, 4th Rated, Placed in Same Tourney Bracket

PORT PAYNE, Ala., Jan. 24 — Scottsboro's rampaging Wildcats, beaten only three times in invitational tournament again the favored team, Alabama's strongest basketball team, the Eighth District. Drawings for the tournament were held at Guntersville last week, with the teams being placed according to their regular season records, excluding tournament play. Following Coach Dusty Carter's top-seeded Wildcats with a 11-0 regular-season career, Albertville's Aggies, Fyffe third with an 8-3 mark. A No. 4 seeded is Pisgah. In the past, over-all records were considered in seeding teams. And had that been the case again this year the bracket would have been an entirely different picture. Pisgah's 11-0 over-all mark, including five wins in the Plainview Class A Jackson County Tourney last and second in the Savannah meet, would have placed the Eagles in the low division, and second to Scottsboro. Then probably Geraldine, Marshall County and Sylva would have pushed Fyffe a notch for the other choices.

However, these are modifications, not reality. The Wildcats stand with Scottsboro, Guntersville and Pisgah in the same bracket, two of the district's strongest teams will be eliminated by the time the finals are played and representatives to the state meet decided. However, the lower bracket is no pushover. The teams are evenly matched, with any of the seven quintets capable of winning the other six and earning a slot in the finals and a berth at the state.

The tournament will be held next week of Feb. 24 through Feb. 27 at Crossville High School's gymnasium. The exact time and date of each game will be announced later by Prof. A. Naylor, the host school's principal. However, in first-round action Scottsboro received a bye. Crossville meets Marshall County, Guntersville; De Kalb, Fort Payne, tangles with J. B. Pennington, Blountsville, and Oneida plays Pisgah.

Same old story, Wildcats win again. This just about sums up the story of the game between the Wildcats and Section here Tuesday night. Don Hutcheson and Pat Trammell led the scoring in the game with 27 and 26 points each consecutively. Other men in the double scoring bracket were Wayne Allison with 20 and John Blackwell with 24.
