Dear Carol,

Last week I visited our old home town of Scottsboro, Alabama. While, I was there, I attended an off-Broadway production of "The South Has Risen Again" produced by Rayford Hodges, and starring of all people, the greatest dramatic actor in the South, Ronnie "Rock" Drummond.
