

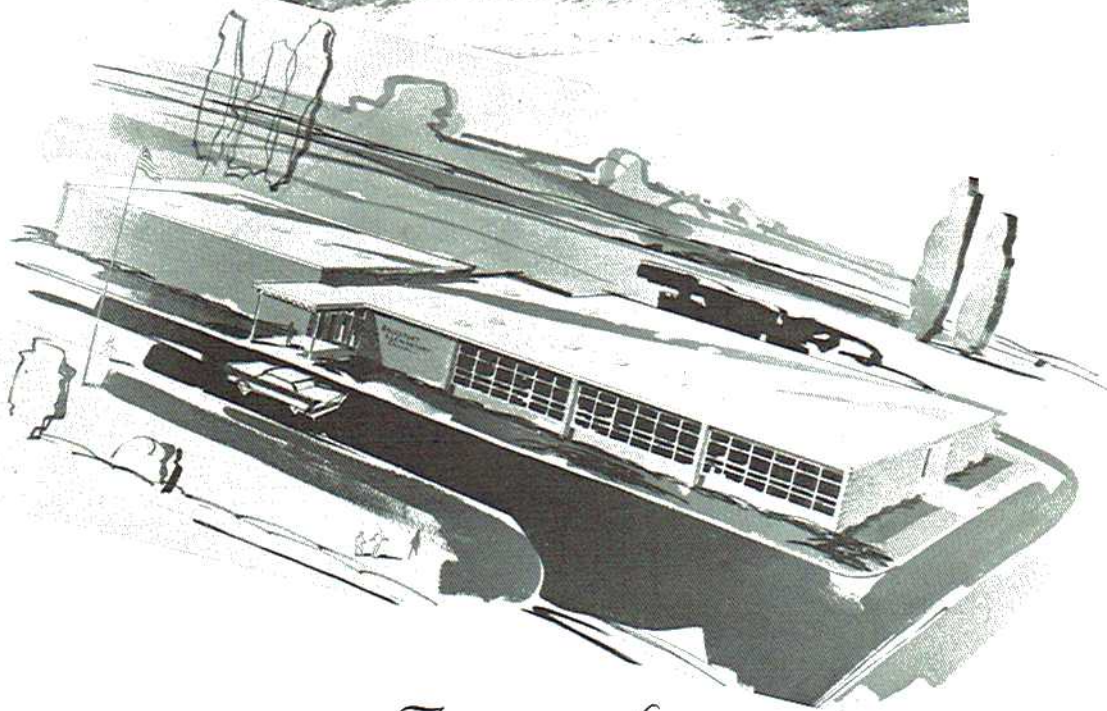
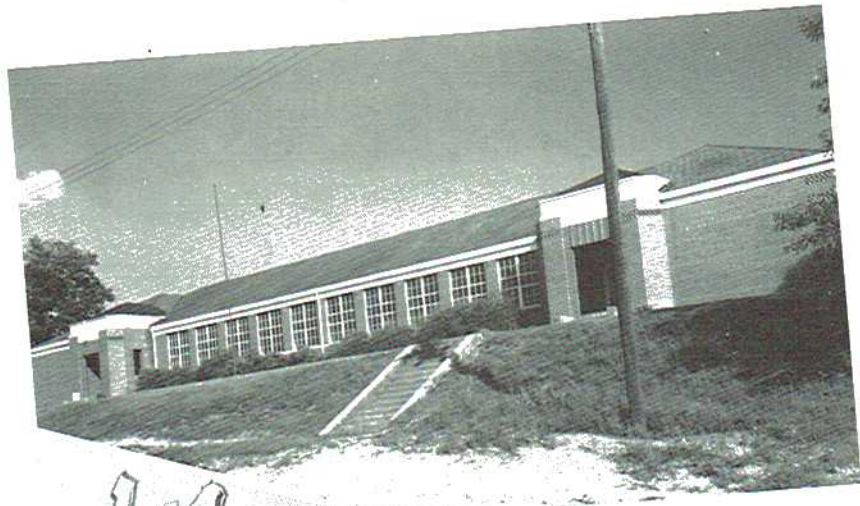

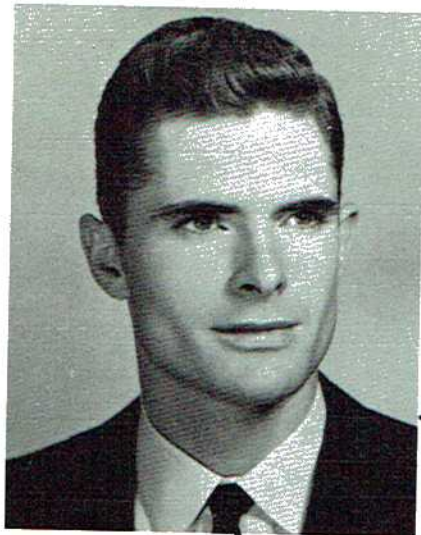


Foreword
