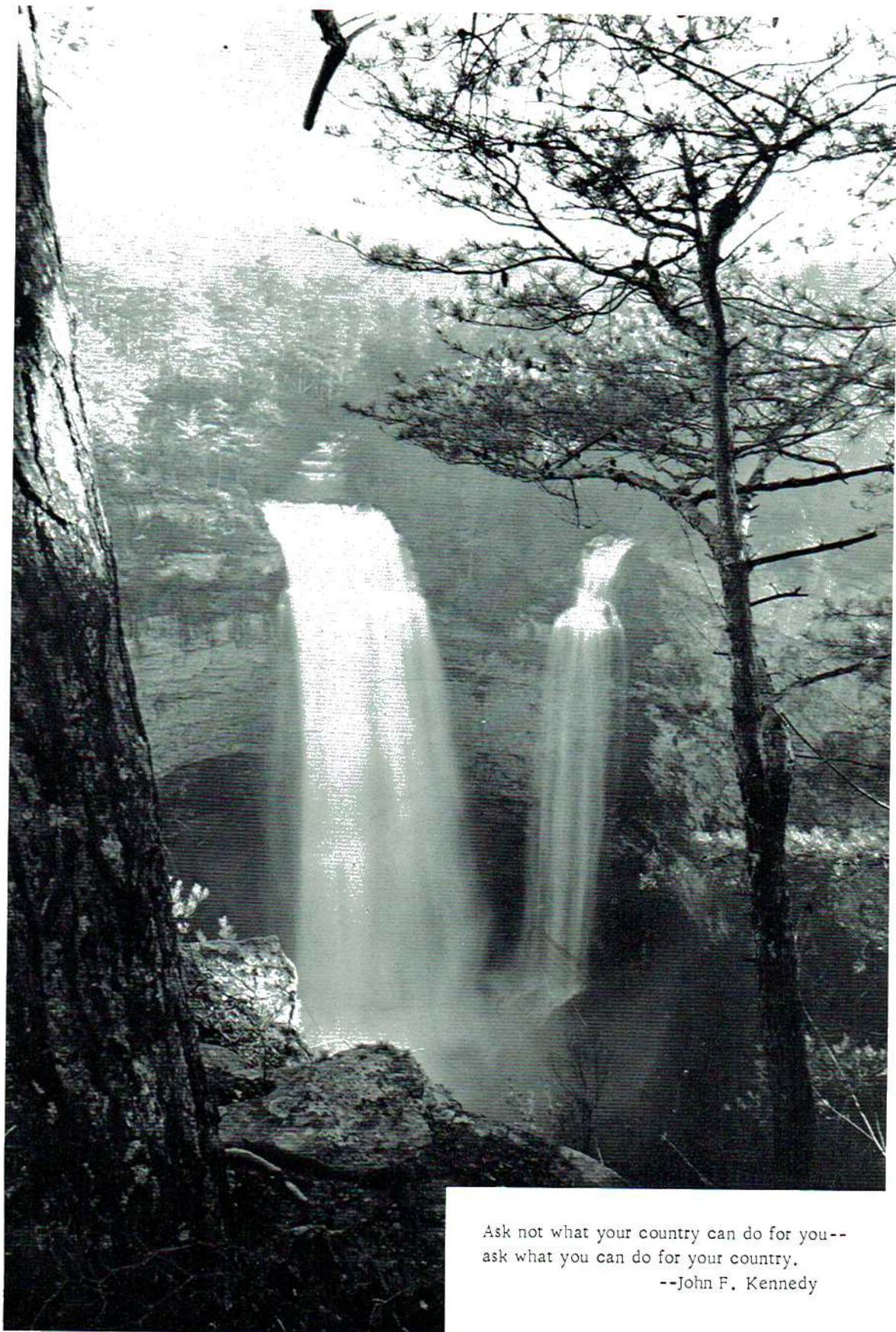


In Memoriam

Letter From the Editor

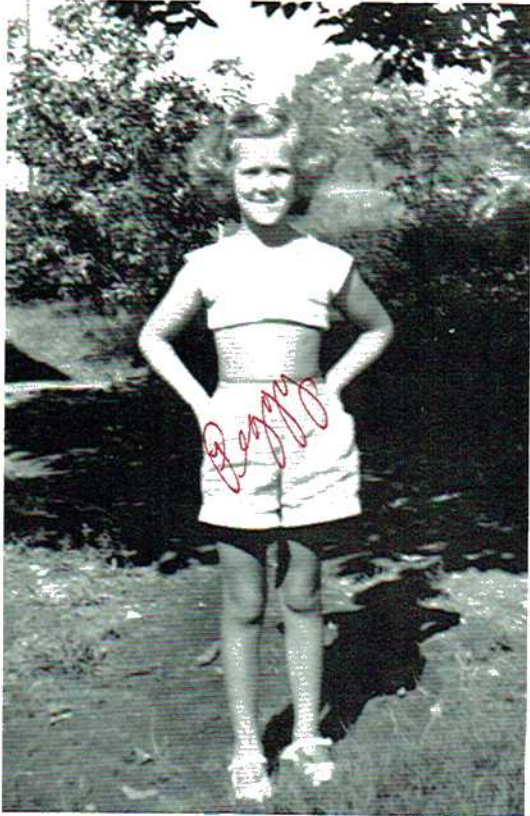
