




Dedication


BARTER

In Memoriam

We would like to take a small space for a memoriam to the late General MacArthur. General MacArthur was a great military leader during World War II and the Korean War. As a result of his many victories in the war efforts, he was the recipient of many awards. Below is a portion of a speech made by General MacArthur at West Point on May 12, 1962. It tells some of the things that the sound of the words, Duty-Honor-Country, can do.

"They build your basic character, they mold you for your future roles as the custodians of the nation's defense, they make you strong enough to know when you are afraid. They teach you to be proud and unbending in honest failure, but humble and gentle in success; not to substitute words for actions, nor to seek the path of comfort, but to face the stress and spur of difficulty and challenge; to learn to stand up in the storm but to have compassion on those who fall; to master yourself before you seek to master others; to have a heart that is clean, a goal that is high; to learn to laugh yet never forget how to weep; to reach into the

future yet never neglect the past; to be serious yet never to take yourself too seriously; to be modest so that you will remember the simplicity of true greatness, the open mind of true wisdom, the meekness of true strength. They give you a temper of the will, a quality of the imagination, a vigor of the emotions, a freshness of the deep springs of life, a temperamental predominance of courage over timidity, an appetite for adventure over love of ease. They create in your heart the sense of wonder, the unfailling hope of what next, and the joy and inspiration of life. They teach you in this way to be an officer and a gentleman."

lies vying for the pennant in the National League. In tennis we see Australia's Fred Stolle and the United States' Dennis Ralston competing for the Davis Cup. Unfortunately we see the U.S. on the losing side . . . IN the world of music, the tops were I WANNA HOLD YOUR HAND, WIPE OUT, LITTLE G.T.O., BLUE VELVET, LAST KISS, AND VIVA LAS VEGAS . . . Moviewise, MOVE OVER DARLING, SPENCER'S MOUNTAIN, TOM JONES, HOW THE WEST WAS WON, and IT'S A MAD, MAD, MAD, MAD WORLD were enjoyed by all . . . The entertainment field has lost several well-known stars including: Gracie Allen, Jim Reeves, Dick Powell, Patsy Cline and Harpo Marks . . . And finally, bookwise, we find many great books dealing with such subjects as politics, civil rights, and the threat of war . . . In conclusion, we would like to say that in happiness as well as in sorrows, the year, as a whole, has been one to remember.
