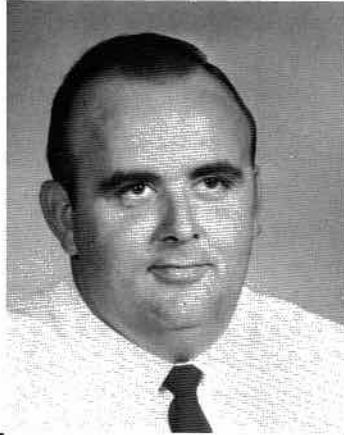


Foreword

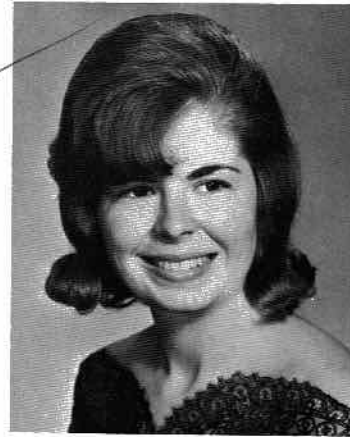


Laugh and Be Merry

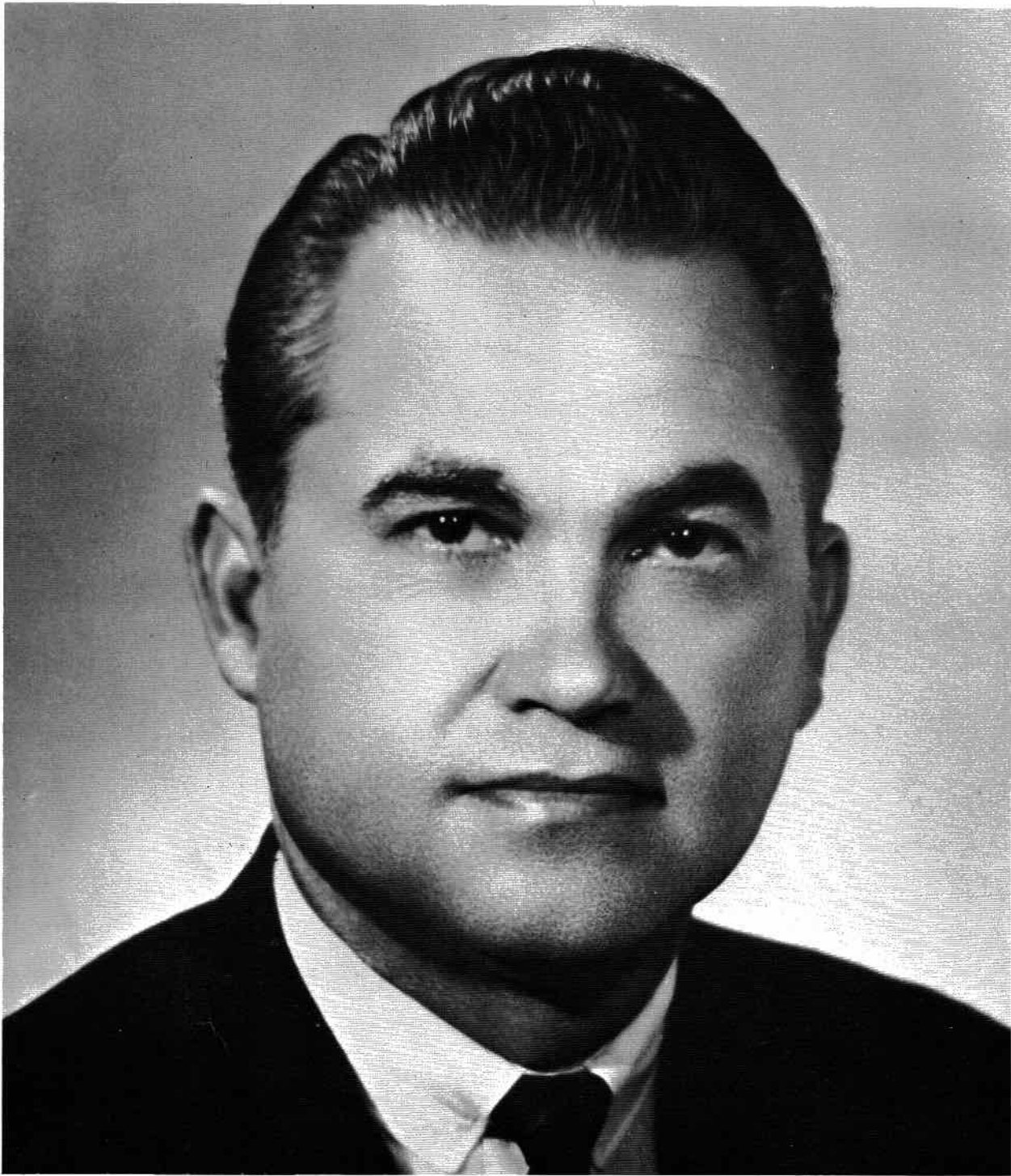
Laugh and be merry, remember, better the world with a song,
