








Pep Rallies Remembered


Staying Tough, Staying Hungry








Homecoming Court





Rising Up, Marching Strong




``83'' Varsity Basketball

The Bridgeport High School 1983 Commencement exercises took place on Friday May 20th at 7:30 p.m.



A special bond between us now Will be torn slowly down As we rise on the future's brow To win our earthly crowns.


We may look back in years to come And be able to lightly laugh, But now as sounds of finality drum, Our hearts are torn in half.
