


# What's in Style


"I always take up for Patrick," Sonia Sebring protectively answered. "Shawn and I go places together now," answered Shannon Anthony.


## Tigers on the Prowl!


# Caught Standing in the Reign!






# "B" Club — the B is for Go Bad!


#### Yearbook Banquet '87



## Finally, it's GRADUATION


Graduation is a special time in life when the members of the senior class begin to look back over the years that have passed and see what they have accomplished.
