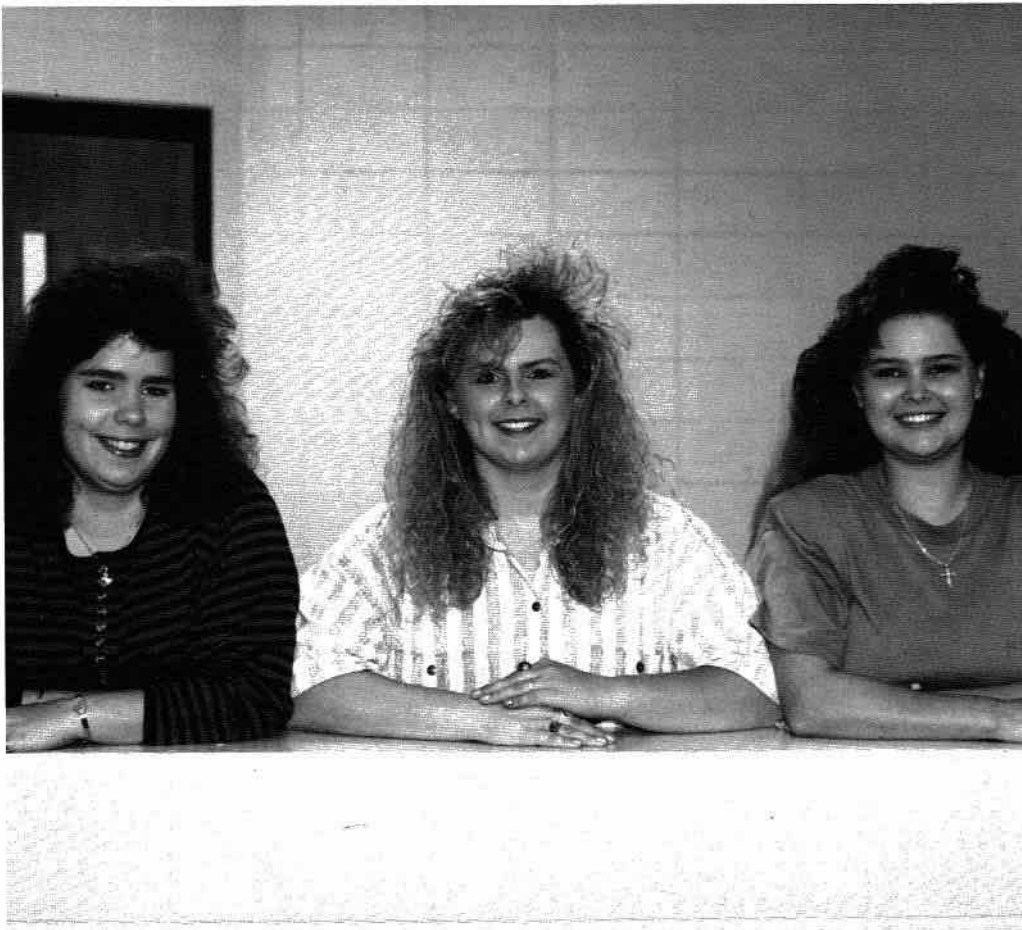
VICA officers — Shane Gray and Garry Smith

HERO



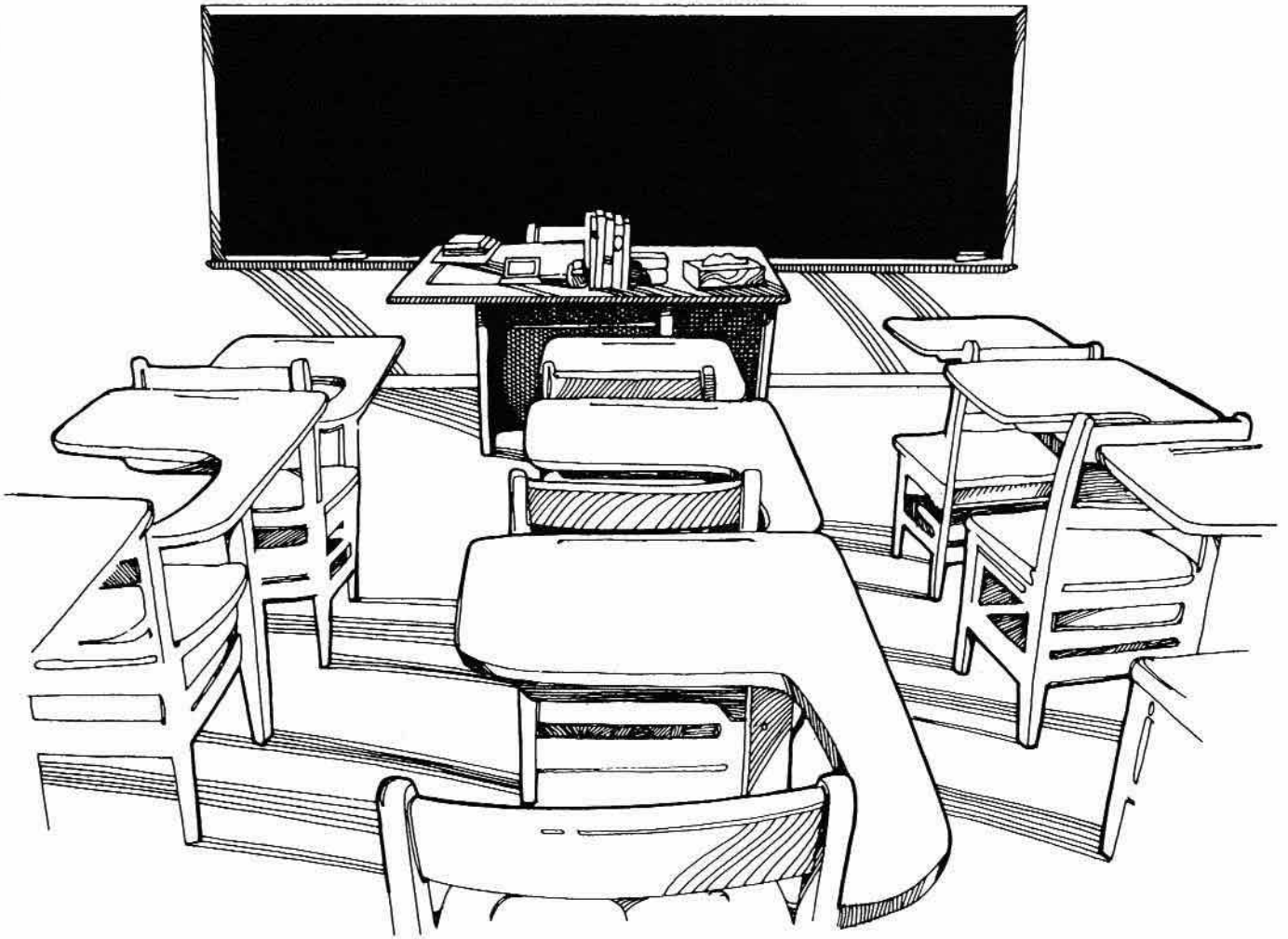

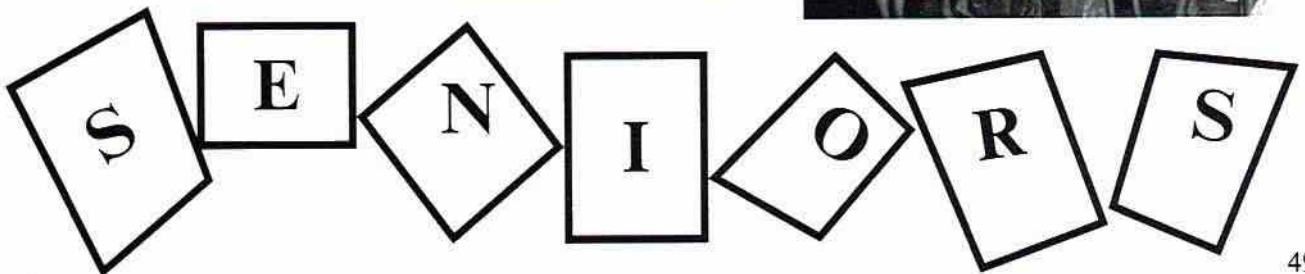


Friends To The End!
