












K.K.A. Sweetheart


Being our third game of the season it boosted our record to 2-0-1.

Fyffe came right back to go ahead 13-12 to end the period, but a great fourth quarter gave the EAGLES the margin they needed to win a truly great game.

The final score found Pisgah had rallied for 2 T.D.'s late in the fourth quarter and prevailed as the dominating team. All these factors and more established the EAGLES an undefeated season. Because of their supreme performance the Pisgah EAGLES never tasted the bitter cup of defeat in 1969.
