### Our Trip To **ATLANTA!**

On Thursday morning May 16, a group of sixty-one boys and girls of Section Junior High School and Mr. Alton Powell and Mrs. Wayne Phillips, sponsors of the trip, left at 5:30 A.M. for a trip to Atlanta. Two busses were chartered from the Northeast Alabama Bus Company of Fort Payne for the trip. We had two most capable drivers, Mr. Lister and Mr. Plunkett of the bus company, that helped in no small way to make our trip the success that it was.

Most of us were up by five o'clock in the morning getting dressed and packing our eats for the day. Each person was responsible for his own food and carried well filled baskets; as you know, traveling gives one a ravenous appetite.

Every one was ready and roll had benn called when the busses came, and we were soon loaded and on our way. Mrs. Phillips and Mr. Powell counted and checked the group many times during the day, and it was well that this was done because some of us could have easily been separated from the group. However, nothing eventful happened to any of us more than blistered heels.

Our first stop was at a service station inside the city limits of Atlanta where we got drinks and exercised ourselves a bit. Our big cry all day was for water. The manager of the Greyhound Bus Station remarked to Mrs. Phillips, as all of us were lined up getting a drink from the two fountains, that she must have brought the whole family.

As we drove through Atlanta on our way to Stone Mountain, we realized that it was much larger than places we had previously visited on our tours including Chattanooga, Montgomery and Birmingham.

Stone Mountain is surely a freak of nature, but one that should be a ''must'' on everyone's list of things to see. We looked at it through telescopes and listened to a recorded lecture of its formation, composition and carvings on the side. Most of us bought cards and souvenirs at the gift shop.

We went to Grant's Park in Atlanta to eat our lunch. After eating we gathered in front of the Cyclorama and entered as a group with special reduced rates to see the world famous panorama painting of The Battle of Atlanta. The painting, measuring fifty feet in height, four hundred feet in circumference and weighing eighteen thousand pounds, was painted in Milwaukee in 1865 by three German artists. Eight thousand pounds of paint were used in the production of this painting. The room was darkened and we listened in complete silence at a recorded lecture telling us about the landscape as a lady focused a light on the particular point in discussion.

We saw the historical engine "Texas" that engaged in the race with "General" presented in all its splendor and housed in the basement of this Cyclorama Building. We were very proud of our selves when the ladies in charge complimented us more than once on the behavior of the group.

We went to the Zoo where we saw almost every animal and bird that we had ever read about. They are all kept in as natural surrounding as their original habitat as is possible to do so. Several took Canoe rides on the lake and after two and one half hours at the park, we still felt reluctant to leave for a tour of the city.


We drove out to the Federal Prison and looked around but did not go inside. We left the busses at the Greyhound Bus Station and walked to as many places as we could. The police were very nice to us often holding the traffic to let our group get across the street. Many strangers on the street made comments to us that made us proud we had chosen Atlanta for our trip.

We went to Rich's store and were on all five floors that covered two blocks. Anything that you could mention could be found there because it seemed like a city within itself. We went to the large Kress store to buy souvenirs of Atlanta. It was amusing to see the great variety of things that we bought.

We went to the State Capitol but we didn't get to see much of it as it was closing time and we had to leavr. It is larger than Alabama's but not any prettier.

Television at Rich's, the immensity of Carnegie Library, the friendliness of the police and the coutersy at the Greyhound Bus Station, all will help us to have lasting memories of our wonderful trip to Atlanta.

Our last stop was to eat supper not too far out from Atlanta, and most of us were so tired that we were able to relax and enjoy our ride home. We reached home about nine o'clock and most of us expressed ourselves as being anxious for a trip next year, probably to Nashville.




