
Willis Bolt has achieved fame as a matador. His matador's clothing and shoes are the sharpest in all Madrid. That's no bull!


Many dedicated hours and efforts are needed to publish an annual of which the student body can be proud. This is just what the 1969 Mountaineer Staff has tried to do.
