It always seemed to enter our talks.

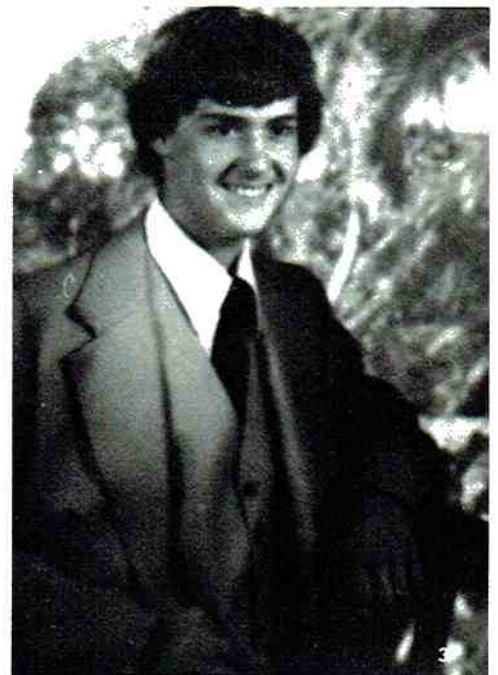
The bad days came

There was only one in the 1978 graduating class that disappointed everyone else. Ricky O'tinger, at the age of 19, retired and became a professional bum.

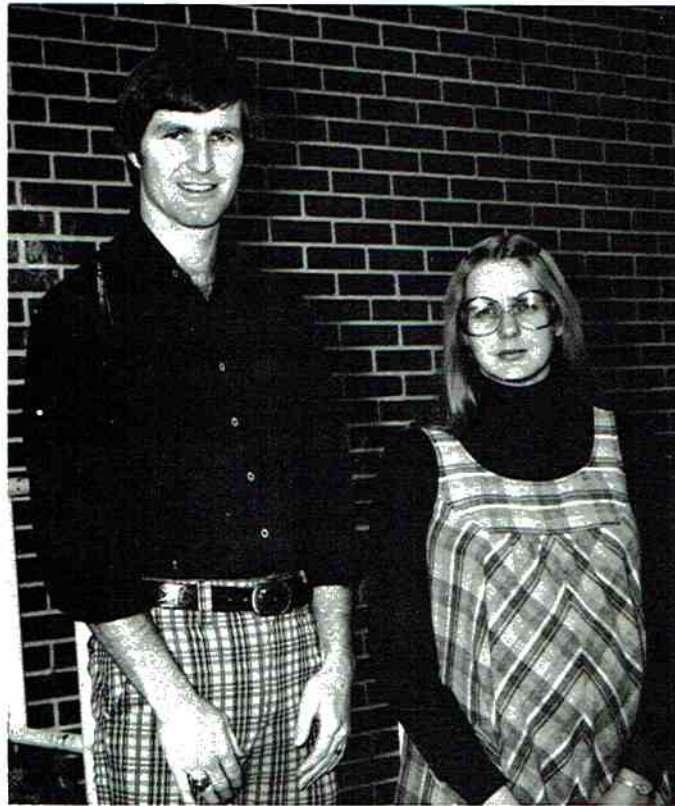

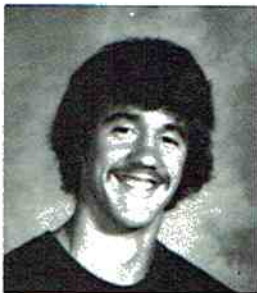
