To a coach, a picture on any of the preceding pages may tell the story of one player's hard work and dedication while, to that player, it is a reminder of a moment of personal joy accomplished by a prayer of thanks for understanding parents. To the parents, a certain snapshot may recall a magical moment one Friday night when great pride in their son was mixed with fear for his safety. The pictures are worth many memories to players and coaches, teachers and preachers, and horn tooters and fence walkers to all those who made the 1977-78 season the extra-special memory as it remains at the spring of year in the mind and heart of one who remembers well:

"The night was full of hope and wonder about the SHS team. The Section Lions had a one-game record on us, and this was our first game of the season. We came away with our first victory at home, 24-0, that September 2nd night.

For our next game on September 9th, SHS traveled for the first time of the year. The field was full of plays and runs, and the game ended with a 46-0 victory over NSM.

The next game was with Pisgah on a wet field of high grass. The footing and the fumbles were uncharacteristic of the Panther team; but the win was 26-7, SHS.

The next game was on Murderers Row, was South Pittsburg, home of the mighty Pirates. This was a game to prove ourselves and our developing tradition of winning. Thompson's foot proved to be an asset. After the Panther defense rose to the occasion, our offense scored the winning two points. We left Beene Stadium with the first victory over SPHS at South Pittsburg in thirty years. The score was 11-9.

The Madison County game was a game of coaches and a game that would determine our berth in the state playoffs. We won the game 34-0, and we thought we were unbeatable!

The Marion County game was a game we thought we had won. We lost the game 18-14, but we maintained our pride and renewed our determination to 'make it to the state!'

The Homececoming game was with the Ider Hornets. The SHS team proved that they hadn't died and would never give up. The game came to a close with a victory of 27-0 in the SHS favor.

The Whitwell game was a match of equals opponents. The Panthers wanted to play ball; and we won the game 23-0.

The Sewanee ballgame was forfeited and the Panthers were unexpectedly blessed with two weeks to prepare for Bridgeport.

The field was covered with ankle-deep water from the preceding week, when the Panthers met the Bridgeport Tigers in Panther Territory. The Panthers left the field at the half behind, 0-10, Although the crowd thought we were through, the second half was a Panther ballgame. We scored 26 points in thirty minutes: while the Tigers scored six. We won the game 26-16, and we were statebound! But on that November 4th night, we looked upon a torn-up field, not with sadness for its shape, but with happiness and honor.


